The grade 5s will use the demonstration from Grade 6 as a provocation for their simple machine that they will build to show transfer of energy and for it to complete a task. CREATIVITY!

In Writing our **Passion Projects** are on their way! The students have been asking questions, and using these to gather research. Others are finished! Hahaha, if only this were actually true. The process is almost more important, especially for a teacher. ;) Anywho. Here is a brief overview to better explain. In a nutshell these get the students to ask questions about things they have a passion for. Search Genius Hour for more details. Then the questions they create will drive their research. As they answer these, more questions will come, and their project will begin to take more shape. From here the students can reimagine their original question, recalibrate their focus, and organize their findings. The expectations here are the students will give a presentation about themselves, with a slideshow to support their work. Lots of work to do, but the process is so valuable. We will also be reflecting on our beginning of semester 2 goals, and writing some personal goals for the start of semester 3.
