I even love all the story lines, the ranking of the teams and the winner-take-all risks involved with each game. I love the strategy, the underdogs, and the commitment shown by the players of the teams. I love that, in the USA, schools have large followings and huge fan bases. I love the emotions of the seniors on the losing team, young men publicly shedding tears, because they just played their last game as a college player. There is so much happening on these teams and in this tournament that I can learn from.

I am always amazed at how, at many levels, sports is able to teach me something about my Christian life. Interesting that March madness falls at the same time as Lent. During March madness we marvel at the teams who work together, who focus on teamwork, and who selflessly elevate the team above the individual. Junior Kindergarten- Mrs. Baarda

This week we will read a few more nursery rhymes and look for the rhyming words in them. I also have some rhyming riddles we can try out!

Our focus letter is **Tt**. We will practice recognizing upper and lowercase T, and practice the sound letter T makes using the Jolly Phonics song and some hands-on activities.

In our workbooks, we will be printing letters M and N.

In **Bible**, as we are nearing Easter, we will take a break from our unit on Parables, and we will be learning about Palm Sunday and the Lord's Supper.

In **math**, we will be looking for numbers in books and stories, and also trying to recognize different representations of numbers.

In health, we will learn about our sense of smell and create the next page in our Five Senses booklet.

Senior Kindergarten- Mrs. Heida

This week we are matching upper and lowercase letters, reviewing the sound of short vowel i, syllable sorting and listening for ending sounds.We will review the sight words the, see, like, a, and I. We will blend together short vowel a and i words such as tip, tap, sip, sap and Pip.

For Handwriting Without Tears, we are working on lowercase K and printing letters on lines and sentences with spaces between each word and punctuation.

In math, we are learning to add using objects and pictures. We will be printing numbers to 20.

In **Bible**, we will hear more about Passover and the Last Supper as well as Jesus's suffering in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Memory Work is John 3:16.

This week, we will complete the final page for our healthy eating unit and their books will be sent home next week.

Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

We continue with our daily Resurrection Egg devotions. Each egg gives us a message of the story of Easter.

Bible: We learned that the people of Israel listened to the 10 fearful spies rather than the two with a good report on the land of Canaan. We discussed that God punishes disobedience to Him. We wrap up our unit on Moses by seeing how Moses lost his patience and what that act cost him. Then, we review Moses' life and show what we know near the end of the week.

Memory words: To connect with Easter, we are learning John 3:16. We practice these powerful words through song, group practice, and actions.

Reading: We continue learning about vowel teams with a focus on the sounds of long i and long o; we will learn that ie and igh and even y can make the long i sound. We will also look at the sounds of long o that are spelled oe, oa and ow. **Word study:** word (yes, the word is word)

Spelling words: This week, we are learning the number of words to ten: zero, one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten. Bonus word this week is: eleven. We will word map the sounds in these words, notice which are heart words, and find other clues to aid in our correct spelling of these words.

Media Literacy Unit: We sure laughed at many of the commercials we watched together to grow in our understanding of media literacy. Ask your child about what product the commercial "Dancing Babies" was selling. Now, we will work on understanding the author's purpose by reading many different books: did the author write their book to inform, persuade, or entertain the audience? This week, students set off to design a cereal box cover to try and persuade a chosen audience (grown ups or children) to buy their newly created brand of cereal.

Math: We continue with skip counting by 2 and 5. Then, we will work on really knowing our doubles to 12, mostly through games. The hope is that students will see that grouping by 2s, 5s, and 10s makes objects easier to count.

Creation Studies: We investigate waterproof versus absorbent materials. Then, we review the purposes of structures and objects. The rest of our week will be spent drawing blueprints and the opportunity to build with various materials; written reflections follow each building opportunity.

Chapter book read aloud: Heartwood Hotel: The Greatest Gift. Videos are posted daily for any absent students.

Art: We make a watercolour resist using blow painting with straws and oil pastels.
