Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

This week is an opportunity for our class to focus on Jesus' death and resurrection through story, song, and short videos. I wish a blessed Easter to all.

Because of the shorter week this week and my ambitious plans last week, we have some catching up to do! We finished off our resurrection egg hunt today by finding the golden egg today. Ask your child what symbol of Easter was in the final (and giant) egg. We are also well into our new devotion read-aloud, The Secrets of the Hidden Scroll: The Final Scroll; it centers on the Easter story.

Reading: Long o vowel teams include: oe, oa, ow and long u vowel teams include: ue, ew. Help your child at home by talking about what words you have all around you at home and make ALL the sounds from left to right in words you see. Spelling: Our words will carry us over 2 weeks (to be tested on Friday April 14). The

words are: toe, boat, coat, crow, flow, tow, grow, glue, blue, new, stew, chew Word study: could and word (carried over from last week)

Math: Some of us need more practice understanding what it means to count by 2s; we will pause on our JUMP Math book work to solidify understanding of this concept. We will also focus on the addition of doubles. Any rote practice of addition and subtraction to 12 at home is helpful. Adding up the total of 2 dice is a great way to practice. Need more ideas? Just ask!

Creation Studies: Building centres take our focus this week. After building with an assigned partner, students are asked to reflect on what went well and what they would have changed about their planned structure.

Here we go for our first week in April :

Math: This week, we are still working on number sense with our focus on subtracting, number lines, and subtracting by counting backwards and counting on.

Writing: Our narrative writing this week focuses on the first signs of spring.

Spelling & phonics: This week, we are studying words with the phonic skill r-controlled: ar sound. When the letter a is in the middle of a word, it typically represents the short vowel a sound. However, when it is followed by r, the sound is changed. In our word study units, we are focusing on students learning an explicit phonics skill rather than memorizing a list of words. Please see the letter attached for the word study practice and spelling homework for the week. Please reach out to me if you have any questions or concerns. **Spelling test on Monday**.

Popcorn words: Please see the letter attached for the popcorn words.

Reading: In our decodable readers, we read a story focusing on the r-controlled: ar sound.

Library: We have our library day on Tuesdays. Please return all library books tomorrow. If you are unsure what the title of the book is that your child needs to bring back to the library, please reach out to me.

Grade 4/5 and 6 French- Ms. VanKampen:

We will continue our focus on the <u>Prepositions of Place</u> (sous, sur, dans, devant, derrière, à côté de; Gr. 6: + à la gauche de, + à la droite de) and the verb ETRE as we apply what we've learned to 'real-life' situations in the classroom with respect to the location of objects and classmates. We will also be using "Ou est/sont _____?" (= Where is/are _____?) An assessment is planned for this Thursday.

<u>Grade 5/6- Mr. Siebenga</u>

In **Bible**, the test is tomorrow. Review questions on the classroom, review jeopardy quiz on the classroom, review sheets are with the students. We complete this week with Passion Week activities.

In **math**, the students continue to work along in their practice books. An update on their progress. Some are working steadily. Others need to remember to bring these books home, and consistently be working on one lesson a day. There is a great deal of differentiation within our class, this requires our students to take that step of autonomy within their work. They are all capable, however sometimes it is easier to point the finger, rather than take responsibility. We CAN do it! A nice reminder, weekly. A quiz was written for Grade 6 today, and a wrap up of Data management for Grade 5 with a Test. Grade 5 moves on to Algebra, and G6ers with further fractions and decimals.

Within our **novel**, we move on to Book the second. An unabridged audio file for the book is in the classroom. Listen along with your student as need be. We will study the themes of compliance, the author's use of light, character development, and what it means to be a hero! Enjoy.

The exploration of how our words impact those around us has taken shape. This week the students will be writing their hypotheses, and completing a proper written explanation to the first few steps of the scientific method. Further work with this to be worked on this week.

In science, the students will be choosing one body system and, along with their classroom partner, they will be looking to apply the information from an information package and their own research to complete a presentation about this particular system. THESE ARE DUE ON FRIDAY. This knowledge will be applied within our "How We Express Ourselves" unit's production of a commercial / public service announcement or rant. More info about this to come, however for now we begin with the Human Body system presentations.

New spelling sorts are up on the G. Classroom. **Memory work**: 1 Peter 2:24 *He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed.*

Grade 7/8 Science- Ms. VanKampen

Our current unit = **Form and Function of Structures**. Concluding topics = 1. Loads on a Structure. 2. Methods Used by Engineers to Ensure Structural Safety. 3. Factors in Designing & Building Structures. 4. Ergonomic Design. Students will be completing a final assignment in the two subsequent weeks to conclude this unit.

Grade 7/8- Mrs. Vogel

Bible: Students have been working on writing their faith story as it stands at this point in their lives. These are not going to be graded but will give me a good idea of where students are and how to continue in this unit and meet students where they are.

Healthy Living: We have begun a short skipping unit where we will learn a number of basic and more complex jumps/tricks. The unit will end with the students working in groups to make a skipping routine using the jumps they have learned throughout the unit.

Guided Reading: We are almost though our short story unit. We will do a short, in class, culminating writing assignment at the end of this week or beginning of next week.

Writing: We are continuing to work through some English grammar work and continue to use our check list on google classroom to know if the work we have finished is ready to hand in.

W.W.W.: We will have our first spelling test this Thursday.

Art: We will be combining art with History and Bible as we look at the grotesques that were crafted to put on the outside of church buildings. If you have newspaper at home that we could use for this project please send it to school by Wednesday.
