This week, we will think about the gift of Christian education. When I walk through the school doors in the mornings and notice the mural in the foyer, I am reminded that we have a gift. The gift is not only a nice building to work in and not only the opportunity to work with children, but it is the gift of the circles. If you remember, the circles on the mural were painted by students, staff, parents, and supporters which represent all the values and virtues we teach. That has nothing to do with the building but everything to do with our identity. The gift is the freedom to teach things like faith in Christ, hope through the resurrection, and the unconditional love that He showers upon us.

Sometimes we don't realize the value of a gift until it is taken away. During the pandemic, we noticed. Teachers felt that our rich value in Christian teaching was compromised. Students realized they were missing something they had taken for granted. Parents longed to have their children back in a school where their own values were taught and sometimes another, or a different, voice was helpful. And now, post pandemic, I hope we continue to reflect on the value of LCS; a Christian school partnering with parents in "educating children while nurturing faith in Christ to interpret and impact God's world" (LCS Purpose Statement).

Monday morning, we will start our assembly with two songs. The first is O Canada. We sing this to remember the gift of a country where we have freedom to openly express our faith without fear and without persecution. The second song is Here I am to Worship. We sing this song as a thanks and reminder that we come to school to worship a God who is "altogether lovely, altogether worthy, altogether wonderful to me".

I pray that we cherish this gift, or better yet, these gifts. God is good!

It is May! This month our theme is Community Helpers. We will explore different jobs that people can do and how we can contribute to our community to make it a great place.

Our focus letter this week is letter Y. We will practice the sound letter Y makes and try to recognize upper and lowercase y by doing some fun activities.

In our workbooks, we will take a closer look at the upper and lowercase letters of the alphabet to see if they look the same and practice the sounds as well.

In math, we will continue printing numbers. We will print numbers 5, 6, and 7. Colour Days: On Tuesdays for the next couple of months we will have special colour days. This week Tuesday is Red Day. Students can dress in red or bring in a red item to show to the class.

In **Bible**, we are continuing our unit on Parables and will read about the Rich Young Man and about the Good Samaritan.

In **health**, we will begin a new unit called "Being Safe". This unit ties nicely into our Community Helpers theme, as does our field trip coming up on June 8th. I will give more information about that after Grandparents Day.

Thursday is Grandparents Day! We are very excited for our special guests to come and visit. Students will be having lunch that they bring to share with their

Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

This week has a few changes to our regular schedule; we have a new seating plan for students when they arrive on Monday morning. Then, Monday afternoon we have a dress rehearsal for the musical. There will be a few other rehearsals for staging and entry to the gym spread over the week.

Thursday will be a different day with our Grandparents/friends and two performances of the musical. Please refer to the weekly messenger for all attire and timing details. Questions are welcome; I'll do my best to give you the information you seek!

In **Bible**, our new memory words are: As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord, Joshua 24:15. A theme of our unit on Settling the Land is seeing how God kept his promise to the Israelites when he brought them into Canaan. This week, we look at the City of Ai and its importance in the story of obeying God. Then we look at how the sun stood still at God's command.

Writing: After much anticipation, we penned our own how-to stories. We published another classroom book from our writings. How fun! Sharing our writing keeps writers accountable and engaged. We choose whether to read it ourselves or have Mrs. Dykstra read it aloud to the class. We are writers!

Reading: We continue to look at r-controlled vowels and focus on how syllables can help us read bigger words! We can break up words into syllable types to understand the sounds in the word and then read all the sounds in words. We are readers! **Spelling:** Words for Friday May 12: farmer, perch, her, germ, serve, anger, tiger, father, mother, ever, water,

Grammar: In our parts of speech study, we look at nouns by using lots of examples to practice.

Math: Money, money, money! We soon move on to recognizing Canadian coins and counting money. Students will add and subtract money amounts up to 20 cents and solve word problems regarding money and coins.

Creation Studies: We have been eagerly anticipating a new unit on animals. Will our chicks hatch this week? We also begin to take care of caterpillars and write the life cycle by observing the changes we see. We will wonder about the differences between vertebrates and invertebrates. We look at the different classifications of animals in God's kingdom and how they are organized.

Chapter book read aloud: Heartwood Hotel, Better Together.

Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

This is a busy and exciting week at LCS. Here is an outline of our work for this first week of May :

Math: This week, we are working on word problems.

Spelling & phonics: Due to the rehearsal and assembly we had today, we will not have new study words and homework for this week, but we will do revision and assessments.

Popcorn words: Please remember to return the popcorn words sheet by Wednesday. You can keep the words and I will send you new words next week if your child is ready, otherwise I will send you a new sheet with dates so that they can keep practicing these words. Writing: The focus has been on their knight writing. We will be editing this writing and checking their spelling and grammar through our editing checklist which can be found on the Writing Google Classroom.

Guided Reading: We have finished our first literature circle role on The Bronze Bow. These roles have been shared and handed in and the students are starting on the next section today. Roles should be done by this Friday.

French: Students are going to be working on writing a conversation piece with a partner and will be presenting this to the class early next week.

Healthy Living: We have finished our jump rope routines and have moved on to Track and Field practice and will be adding in Baseball as well.

Grade 7/8 Math- Mr. Boelens

With our integer units completed, folders of marked work should be coming home to be signed. This week, both classes will be working on their algebra units. Grade 7 is looking at some early algebra concepts while Grade 8 is beginning to prepare for high school math. Daily homework will be assigned.
