On Monday, I am away and Mrs. Siertsma will be in to teach for me; Aka Mrs. S. This week, we will continue to work the letter sounds and blending them together, identifying beginning and ending sounds, rhyming words, and counting the number of syllables per word.

In **math**, we will begin a unit on solid shapes such as cylinders, cubes, and spheres. Students continue to practice printing numbers without reversals. We are counting to 100 and some are still becoming familiar with the teen numbers. In **Bible**, we will finish the unit of Jesus' Miracles and begin with Jesus' Ministry. We will be making a very hungry caterpillar and a coffee filter butterfly before moving onto the next creepy crawly.

<u>Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra</u>

In **Bible** class, we studied Othniel the Judge. Unfortunately, the cycle of the Judges starts all over again when he dies. God offers another chance to the Israelites; God chose Gideon to be one of Israel's deliverers. Our new memory words are from Psalm 18: 1-2: I love you, LORD, my strength. Reading: long and short sound produced when two "oo"s are together in a word. **Spelling**: wool, foot, look, wood, good, cook, gloom, tool, cool, roof, mood, food **Writing**: Insects will be our inquiry topic this week. We become entomologists this week as we observe our caterpillars enter the pupa stage.

Math: We have a few assessments on our coin counting unit yet to go this week. Then, we will cover two units on addition and subtraction strategies. The goal is accuracy and speed when solving equations.

Chapter book read aloud: The Chocolate Touch, by Patrick Catling. John Midas is delighted when, through a magical gift, everything his lips touch turns into chocolate.

Health: We meet our health puppets, Sam the elephant and Terry the koala, as we examine emotions.

I hope you had a special Mother's day celebrating your own mothers and celebrating the incredible gift of being a mother too. Here is an outline of our work for this week:

Math: This week, we are working on measuring and skip counting.

Spelling & phonics: This week, we are studying words with the phonic skill long oo. A variant vowel is a group of letters that represents the sound of a vowel. In our word study units, we are focusing on students learning an explicit phonics skill rather than memorizing a list of words.

Popcorn words: Please remember to practice reading the popcorn words every day and completing the sheet that needs to be returned. Thank you to all the sheets that came back last week. I am so proud of these students and they are proud of themselves too. Thank you for encouraging them to read and write these words at home. Please reach out to me if you have any questions.

Writing: This week, we are still working on opinion writing.

Reading: In our decodable readers, we read a story focusing on the phonic skill long oo.

Grade 4/5 and 6 French- Ms. VanKampen:

We have concluded our unit on Time (Quelle heure est-il?).

While this week [and perhaps next] may seem "dry", we will be focussing on some grammar topics which are "part and parcel" to understanding/speaking/reading/writing the French language:

1. adjectives and their agreement [i.e. masculine vs feminine forms] with the nouns which they are describing 2. the preposition "de" and using it to indicate possession

3. the possessive adjectives my [mon/ma/mes], yours [ton/ta/tes], his/hers [son/sa/ses] for singular and plural nouns accordingly.

Additional topics for Grade 6:

4. the conjunctions 'but' and 'because'

5. adverbs and expressions of quantity

Grade 5/6- Mr. Siebenga

To all the mothers out there. Thank you. You Rock. ;)

In **Bible**, we will continue on with our study of Jesus. Thank you to those who helped send in supplies for our baptism comparisons. This week, we will explore His first miracle, Nicodemus, and the Living Water.

In **math**, both grades will be completing quizzes today. Grade 6 on translations, reflections and rotations of geometric shapes. Grade 5 on equivalent fractions, mixed numbers and the parts of a fraction. Check in later this week with your student to see how these turned out and what they should concentrate on reviewing.

Within our **novel**, we have moved on to Book the **Fourth**. An unabridged audio file for the book is in the classroom. This week, we will be reading chapters 45-48. Listen along with your student as need be. We will study the themes of compliance, the author's use of light, character development, and what it means to be a hero! Enjoy.

As we continue on with our media endeavour, we will discuss ways in which we talk to one another, how people talk at us, and how we, as Christians, are called to make disciples of all nations. Some students have yet to complete their rough copy of their campaign pieces - (Advertisements, Rants, and Public Service Announcements.) This week, we will be linking scriptural texts to their sustainable goal and ideas to enable their audience a reference point as to what God speaks about such issues. On Friday, a rough copy of their report is due on the G. classroom. Next Wednesday, the finished typed report. We will be working through the data together, and they will have the procedural components of the **scientific** method to put within their report.

In Physical, Social, and Emotional Education (**PSPE**) we will pick up with a week of Softball practice during PE time. In **health**, we will be looking more in depth at our human development and sexual health next week.

French: Students have finished one presentation last week and are working on another one this week. They should have their petit sketch written out and will be presenting it during class on Wednesday.

History: We finished our Medieval Unit last week with a test on Friday. I will return them as soon as I'm able. We still have a few students that need to write the test. This was our final history unit for the year.

Geography: With the finishing of our history unit, we are going to move to Geography one more time before the end of the year. We will be looking at Global Inequalities: Economic Development and Quality of Life.

Healthy Living: Look for a letter to come home today in the kid mail to do with our upcoming health unit. In phys. ed we continue to prepare for track and field, learn more about baseball and run the 1500m race during phys. ed class. We will also be running the 400 m. race in class at some point in the next week or so.

Writing: We continue to work on writing in a number of different subjects.
