Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

We are working steadily along in Grade One. We tried new skills last week such as note-taking, copying long sentences in our entomologist journal, writing in our feelings journal, telling time to the hour and half-hour. It is good to see the students' stamina and grit in these final weeks.

Library: Please have your child return all library books this week. If your child has lost or misplaced a library book, please ask for the reimbursement cost and send payment to the school as soon as possible.

In **Bible**, we continue to work on memorizing Psalm 18: 1-2, with daily practice. We've almost got it down pat! This week we will finish off our unit on Judges. Our final unit is on Samuel and Saul; God kept his promise to the Israelites even though they were unfaithful. God directed Samuel to anoint first Saul and then David to be Israel's first two kings.

Reading/Writing: Poetry practice as well as writing about our feelings in Health. Spelling: Our final "show what you know" for spelling words is Friday, June 16 (note the change of date due to no school on Thursday). We will practice compound words (using graphemes and syllable rules we have practiced all year): footrest, sunfish, suntan, pigpen, dishpan, himself, sandbox, bathtub, pickup, hotdog, sunset, teapot.

Math: Probability and data management is our final unit; we wrap up our telling time unit before we transition to that final unit of Grade One math.

Creation Studies: God's beautiful plants are the final unit we are exploring. What are the needs of plants? To complement this, we will read a few versions of The Enormous Turnip, a folk tale.

Chapter book read aloud: Heartwood Hotel series: Home Again.

<u>French 4/5:</u> Les Parties du Corps: Students have made great progress in completing their body outlines. Following colouring, body parts will be labelled. A brief write up [about one's physical appearance] will accompany this assignment.

Guided Reading: Students have received a schedule of reading and assignments in order to be able to finish the book by the end of the school year. Today, chapters 13-15 were due. Chapters 16-18 are due on Wednesday, June 14

Bible: We are continuing to look at the persecution of Christians by the Jews and Romans in the early church.

Geography: We are continuing to learn about how quality of life also affects many other aspects of a person's/nation's economy and ability to live out their life to it's fullest possibilities.

Healthy Living: We are going to be enjoying some sports and games chosen by the students this week in phys. ed. Students are still expected to wear their gym clothes and appropriate footwear to participate in class. We will also have one last health class in which boys and girls will be split from grades 5-8 to finish off our Sexual Health unit.
