This week at a glance:

Math - 2D shapes. Students will be beginning a collaborative project with their reading buddies creating dream homes out of shapes. I'll share pictures as they get developed!

Science - God's Creatures Large & Small! All of the amphibians projects were so well done and the students loved learning from eachother. Students are beginning an in class inquiry project on a reptile of their choice. At home, you can ask them what they have learned about their animals. Encourage discussion about the differences between reptiles, amphibians, and fish. Such as where they live, if they are cold or warm blooded, do they have live babies or eggs, and what their diets consistent of!

Health - We will be learning about healthy food choices and creating healthy eating habits as a way to care for our bodies that God has created.

I am so very encouraged by the outcome of last week's assessments on numbers! In order to keep you abreast of your child's progress, the 'test' has been sent home in the KidMail envelope. As proof of your viewing, <u>please sign it and have your son/daughter return this document to me yet this week.</u>

Our current focus is on the weather and seasons, with a formal assessment for each grade planned for next week.

Grade 5/6- Mrs. O'Boyle

Bible - We will begin a unit called "The Setting of God". In this unit we will introduce key places and events in Bible history, analyze the organization of the books of the Bible, and discuss biblical languages. We will study maps and timelines, and will learn about the setting and chronological order of salvation history.

Our **memory work** is: "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17" Due Fri. Oct. 13th.

Language - We will continue to look at nouns, specifically possessive, proper, and common nouns. We will look at choosing an appropriate topic for our audience in our written work. We will learn to state our main idea in a topic sentence and then provide interesting details that support the main idea. We will look at text features and visual information to help us with our reading comprehension. Our words of the week are: diplomatic, taunt, jester, and obsolete. Social Studies - We will continue our unit - "Why is there French on my cereal box?" We will continue to review the terms culture, worldview and choices this week.

Science - We will continue our unit - "Fearfully and Wonderfully Made" where we will be looking at human organ systems. This wee,k we will look at what physical fitness is and how we know if we are fit and what we can do to be fit. Art - We will continue to look at the element of line and will begin to tie in shape, form, and movement as we look at sculpture. We will also look at the work of Alexander Calder.

Health - We will conclude our anti-bullying unit.

Spelling- We will have our spelling dictation on Fri. Oct. 13th.

Math: Given Thanksgiving Day and Cross Country, we have limited math classes this week. Friday we will prepare for a test coming up next week.

Gym: We are trying to develop our skills in volleyball so we can have a good game.

Grade 7/8 Science- Ms. VanKampen

Unit -- Water Systems

This week we will: conclude the topic on *Testing of Water Quality Characteristics* and then begin looking at the reality of *Water Issues in Ontario* and Canada for various urban centres as well as some of our First Nations/Indigenous Peoples' communities. Students will be completing some independent research on these water issues by way of online articles and videos.

Grade 7/8 Math- Mr. Boelens

We in our second unit: ratios. This week we will learn about equivalent ratios, comparing ratios, and applying them to solve problems. Daily work is assigned. Unit one marked work should be coming home this week. Please review and sign them so students can return them to me.

Grade 7/8- Mrs. Vogel

Happy Thanksgiving everyone. I hope you were able to enjoy your long weekend with friends and family and looking at the many blessings we have been given.

I encourage you to keep checking the google classroom calendar with your child(ren) as I try to keep all the assignments and due dates up to date on there.

Scholastic orders are due Friday, October 20.

Bible: Bible worksheet pg. 15 was due today. The students have been working hard on a mural depicting the entire Exodus story from Moses and Aaron going to see pharaoh for the first time to the Israelites crossing the sea. Look for pictures to come hopefully this week as we finish it up and hang it up for all see and hopefully learn the story a little bit more. **French**: Well done on the quiz this past week! You all did so well. We are going to continue verb and grammar review from grade 6 and will have another quiz on aller and faire on Friday, October 13.

Art: We have been working on our Bible mural in art as well.

Music: Our books have finally (almost) all arrived and we will be able to begin playing songs together and learning or relearning how to read the notes on the staff. Brass players learned how to use a ping pong ball and their mouthpieces to practice how much air is needed to maintain proper and consistent sound. Clarinet and Saxophone players are continuing to use their 2 tricks to practice how much mouthpiece should be in their mouth to maintain proper sounds, clarinet players are also practicing making sure their fingers fully cover the holes as missing even a sliver of the hole produces a nice squeaking sound. Flutes are working on mouth shape (embouchure) and blowing overtop of a small mouth bottle to make the sound there first and then transferring that feeling and knowledge to the flute. Percussion players are practicing their paradiddles (ask them if you want to know more!). All students have learned at least 3 notes and should be able to move smoothly between each note and play whole notes and rests, half notes, and quarter notes in various rhythmic patterns. **Healthy Living:** We have moved to volleyball in Phys. Ed. class, and we are nearing the end of our digital citizenship unit in health class. We also have gone over how to use google classroom, how to use google docs for assignments, and especially how to spell/grammar check their work before printing and/or handing in. We also talked about how to address and word emails to teachers and appropriate amounts of times between emails on the same subject.

History: We began our New France research and presentation project this past week. Students will have class time on Thursday to finish their research and should be done the research by next Monday. Presentations will start on Thursday, October 19 and are to be approximately 10 min. long and include a handout/worksheet for the rest of the class. All groups have been made and have the instruction for their topic.

Writing: We will begin a grammar review this week in writing focusing on the rules of periods, commas, and capitals as that seems to be an area of weakness in our class. We will also be having regular printing and cursive assignments to continue to work on the legibility of the writing being handed in.

W.W.W.: We finished our first sort and will begin our second sort (week 2). We will work with the words throughout the week and have a quiz on 10 of the words on Friday, October 13. The test and the work for the sort will be due on Friday, October 19.

Guided Reading: We started reading the short story "The Rocket" last week and will continue reading this week as well as answering questions about the story.
