Bible: This week we are continuing on with our story of Abraham. Please keep practicing our Memory work for this month at home. We practice it at school, but extra practice every day at home helps too! We learned value lessons and had lots of fun searching. This week we will start our new unit One Body, Many Parts: Our Home and School Communities. This unit will challenge us to make a difference in both their family and school communities. We will start by looking at how God calls us to be a unit and how we have one body with many parts.

## Grade 2- Mrs. Kuipers

Math - Students finished designing their dream homes by using 2D shape tracers last week and are working on adding primary and secondary colours before passing their designs onto the grade $5 \& 6$ class where they will be built into a 3D model! This week we are starting non standard measurements. Students will be encouraged to compare length and heights or various items and will explore how to select appropriate units and utilize them effectively to measure.
Science - A review will come home this week Wednesday for a end of unit assessment next week on creatures large and small with an emphasis on Reptiles, Amphibians, and Fish. Please spend a few minutes each night going over the information with your child to prepare for their assessment.

## Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

I hope you had a lovely weekend. This is a short school week for our students.
Math - Number sense: We are starting a new unit on addition and subtraction with numbers up to 100 .
Phonics, spelling and reading: This week, we are still reviewing long vowel sounds in words with silent E. Please see the homework practice (only 1 this week) going home today to help the students practice this phonic skill. The decodable text we are working on in class this week will only be going home tomorrow.
Creation studies - Social science: Our focus is on legends and creating our own maps this week.
Bible: We are looking at God's people the next 2 weeks.
Library: We have library tomorrow. They are allowed to borrow 2 library books at a time. If they return their books tomorrow, they can either renew it or get 2 new books. ## Grade 5/6- Mr. Boelens

Math: We are working on place value which will lead to adding and sutraing larger numbers.
Gym: Monday we will practice our serves.

## Grade 5/6- Mrs. O'Boyle

Bible - We will continue our unit, "The Setting of God". In this unit we will introduce key places and events in Bible history, analyze the organization of the books of the Bible, and discuss biblical languages. We will also study maps and timelines, and will learn about the setting and chronological order of salvation history.
Our memory work is: The Books of the Bible and will be due on Nov. 3rd.

Language - We will begin to look at adjectives. We will look at including details that support the main idea in our written work. We will look at descriptions to help us with our reading comprehension. When an author writes a text with a description structure, the author uses descriptive details, examples, and reasons to support the main idea.
Our words of the week are: exaggerate and tendency.
Spelling- We will have our spelling dictation on Mon. Oct. 30th.

Social Studies - We will continue our unit - "Why is there French on my cereal box?" We will continue to learn about the culture of New France and of my classroom and explore faith/religion as a determining aspect of culture.
Science - We will continue our unit - "Fearfully and Wonderfully Made" where we will be looking at human organ systems. This week we will look at what physical fitness is and how we know if we are fit and what we can do to be fit. We will also look at how food and oxygen move to cells and how carbon dioxide and waste leave the body. Finally, we will look at cellular metabolism and how materials move in and out of a cell.
Art - We will look at shape and form and will work on taking a 2-D image and making it 3-D.
Health - We will begin our Healthy Eating unit. We will be looking specifically at how to read nutritional labels this week. They did a good job on their presentations and some of that information will also be on the test so they do need to study the handouts that they were given for other group presentations.
Healthy Living: We will not have health class this week due to the short week.
Music: We are going to be working on the musical for part of our music classes as well as continuing to learn to play our instruments together. We are making some great progress. I will be having some sectionals at lunch times over the next couple weeks. Today is flutes, Wednesday is clarinets, next week Wednesday will be saxophones, and Thursday will be trumpets. The following week will be French horns, low brass, and percussion.
French: We will be starting a unit on hockey this week.
Art: We have finished our mural on Exodus. Look for it to be hung up sometime soon...once I figure out how to hang up such a large piece. We started working on making our own moveable manikin to be able to study how the human body moves and what proportions the human body generally has.
