This week we will wrap up our fall theme and we will begin a new theme for November about transportation and explore different ways we can travel. Since we had such a short week last week our mystery letter will be the same as last week, letter Ii.

# Senior Kindergarten- Mrs. Heida

What a fantastic convention! It was great to learn some new ideas and connect with those who teach SK! Such a blessing!

This week we will be looking at the letter Ff by the sound it makes, how to print it, listening for it at the beginning and ending of words. We will also be introduced to the high frequency word "a".

In math, we will focus on the concept of less than by matching objects and using the number line 1 to 5. A quick game to play at home is to tell your child two numbers and ask which one is more or less.

In **Bible**, we will begin a unit on the story of Abraham who was told to move to another land while not even knowing where he was going. What faith Abraham had in God to lead Him safely. Ask your child on Thursday where we went?

For printing this week, we are going to review the letters F, P, S, M, A and T. We will wrap up our Fall unit on Monday and move onto Pete the Cat. We will have a fun and crazy time reading his stories and creating Pete the Cat way!

# Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

I can't believe this is the end of October already. Thank you for signing up for our P-T conferences. I look forward to meet with you this week. My apologies for those conferences that I will be missing. I work as administrator in our church office on Thursdays and Fridays from 9am - 4pm. I will reach out to you in an email if I will not be able to join Mrs. Kuipers to meet with you.

Here is an outline of the work we will be doing this week:

Math - Number sense: We continue our unit on addition and subtraction with numbers up to 100 with specific focus on ordering numbers to 100. Phonics, spelling and reading: this week we are looking at exceptions to the silent e rule as well as reading and spelling words ending with -es. Please see the homework practice sheet and decodable text going home this week to help the students practice these phonic skills (they will go home on Thursday/Friday every week). Creation studies - Social science: This week our focus is on creating our own maps. Bible: This week we are looking at how God's people return and await the Messiah. Library: We have library tomorrow. They are allowed to borrow 2 library books at a time. If they return their books tomorrow, they can either renew it or get 2 new books. Please encourage them to develop the habit of bringing their books to school every Tuesday, even if they would just like to renew it.

### Grade 2- Mrs. Kuipers

I look forward to meeting with you all on Thursday night (and Friday morning). Please come with any feedback or questions you may have. Time slots are short and we are fully booked all night, so punctuality is key! If you are available, we would love to see you earlier in the day at our assembly.

Math - Grade 2 is learning about non standard measurements. Students will be encouraged to compare length and heights of various items and will explore how to select appropriate units and utilize them effectively to measure. Encourage students to explore measuring and comparing toys, tables, and other items at home.

**Science** - a review came home on Wednesday for an end of unit assessment on Reptiles, Amphibians, and Fish. Please spend a few minutes each night going over the information with your child to prepare for their assessment and look through their duotang work to explore their learning this far. The test will be on Thursday. If you did not receive a review or have misplaced it, please email me and I can send a digital copy. Return all green duotangs back to school on Thursday as well.

#### Grade 3- Mrs. Claus

Wow! What an amazing time I had at the Edvance Teacher's Conference. It was so good to hear from other schools, teachers, and leaders. I learned about new things going on in education that I'd like to implement in Grade 3. Thank you for this opportunity.

Bible: We had our Bible test. We are now moving on to the next unit, In the Beginning.Math: We have finished our unit on patterns and are starting our unit on Number Sense today.Creation Studies: We have started a book on a family that moved from New York to Canada as pioneers.Language: This week is the beginning of splitting the class to reach the students where they are. The Red group will continue with vowel review and add on digraphs with double letters (ff, ll, ss, zz) The Blue group will start with an assessment to discover their strengths and weaknesses. #### Grade 4/5/6 French (Madame Van Kampen):

This week we will continue learning about the verb FAIRE (=to do or to make). More specifically, students will begin a project of creating a poster (Gr. 4) or booklet (Gr. 5 & 6) with sentences and images using this verb.

Again, please encourage and/or help your son/daughter in committing this verb to memory as it will be used throughout their French 'career'. Grade 4 is expected to learn, minimally, the left column; Grades 5 & 6, all.

#### Grade 5/6- Mr. Boelens

Math: We continue to learn more about multi-digit addition and subtraction. Gym: Each class we practice a different skill. This week we will practice sets and play a little game.

#### Grade 5/6- Mrs. O'Boyle

**Bible** - We will continue our unit, "The Setting of God". This week we will learn about the setting and chronological order of salvation history.

Our memory work is: The Books of the Bible and will be due on Nov. 2nd.

**Language** - We will look at adjectives in grammar, as well as adding proper punctuation marks for dialogue. We will look at including details that support the main idea in our written work. We all also explore developing our character, setting and plot ideas. We will look at descriptive details and how they give reasons to support the main idea to help us with our reading comprehension. Our words of the week are: tendency, persistent and extricate. Challenge your child to use these words at least once in a sentence this week.

Spelling - Please watch for new lists coming home in your child's agenda later this week.

**Social Studies** - We will continue our unit - "Why is there French on my cereal box?" We will continue to learn about the culture of New France and of our classroom and explore faith/religion as a determining aspect of culture. We will also explore how the Bible is central to the culture of the Christian school and classroom.

**Science** - We will continue our unit - "Fearfully and Wonderfully Made" where we will be looking at human organ systems. This week we will continue to look at what physical fitness is and how we know if we are fit and what we can do to be fit. We will also look at how food and oxygen move to cells, and how carbon dioxide and waste leave the body. We will also explore cellular metabolism and how materials move in and out of a cell.

**Art** - We will look at shape, form, and colour and will work on taking a 2-D image and making it 3-D. We will be working on a partner project with the grade one and two classes for this week's assignment where the Grade 5/6 students will use the Grade 1/2 2-D drawings as blueprints to create 3-D representations of their dream homes. Students will have to work to understand the original artist's vision, and will also have the opportunity to add their own creative ideas to the project. **Health** - We will continue our Healthy Eating unit. Please remember to complete your grocery store scavenger hunt, which is due Mon. Nov. 6th.

Bible: Bible test on the Themes of the Old Testament today! Moving into our next unit tomorrow.

Writing: We began our plagiarism unit last week and students will be learning and exploring different ways to avoid plagiarism and why it is so important. We learned last week that you can actually plagiarize yourself!
