#### Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

With the cold and rainy weather we have been having lately, I would like to encourage you to send an extra pair of clothes, socks, and mittens to school. **Please make sure you label them**. Here is an outline of the work we will be doing this week:

**Math** - Number sense: This week, we finish "adding with a number line" and move on to "adding by counting on". **Phonics, spelling and reading**: This week, we are looking at reading and spelling words with closed and open syllables as well as compound words. Please see the homework practice sheet going home today to help the students practice these phonic skills.

**Creation studies - Social science:** We are continuing our unit on Our Local Community and will be focusing on leaders and citizens this week.

**Bible:** This week, we look at the foreign rulers during the Intertestamentary times. We also take a look at who the Pharisees and Sadducees were and what the Sanhedrin is.

Please remind your child to read and learn our November memory verse: "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight." Proverbs 3:5-6 **Library**: We have library tomorrow. They are allowed to borrow 2 library books at a time. If they return their books tomorrow, they can either renew it or get 2 new books. Please encourage them to develop the habit of bringing their books to school every Tuesday, even if they would just like to renew it.

#### Grade 4 and 5 - Mrs. Delleman

I Know It - NO I Know It due this week, to allow time for students to study for their math quiz on Thursday. Math - We will have a quiz on measurement, time, and mass/temperature on THURSDAY. Students will need to know how to measure and convert between mm, cm, m, km, they will need to know how to tell time, digitally and in words, and draw it on a clock. Grade 4s will need to know the proper mass (g, kg) and Grade 5s will need to know how to read a thermometer. Smartboard notes will be sent home on Wednesday in preparation for the quiz.

**Spelling Dictation** - Dictation will be on THURSDAY. Students should know what team they are on. The teams are listed below and are also on spellingcity.com/tdelleman if students would like to practice their words online. Students will need to know all their spelling words, but only 10 are chosen for dictation.

#### Grade 4/5/6 French -Madame Van Kampen:

We have concluded our unit on the verb FAIRE (to do, to make). Some time will be given yet on mardi (Tuesday) for students to finish their FAIRE assignment (booklet or poster) for submission; this is the final component of the Term 1 assessment. Our next unit will focus on Places & Spaces and Modes of Transportation with incorporation of the verb ALLER (to go). Again, this is a verb that students will make use of throughout their French 'career' and thus students will need to commit this verb and its conjugations to memory.

#### Grade 5/6- Mrs. O'Boyle

**Bible** - "The Setting of God" unit test will be on Tues. Nov. 14th. We will begin a new unit called, "Later Judean Ministry". Jesus' ministry can be divided in three main parts: 1) the events that occurred in and around Galilee 2) the events that took place in Judea and Perea, and 3) the events of the final week in Jerusalem. This unit works through the second part - Jesus' later Judean ministry. This unit uses parables throughout, since this was one of Jesus' favourite methods of teaching. Our **memory work** is: "But the Lord said to Samuel, 'Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.' Samuel 16:7" Due Nov. 21st.

Language - We will continue to look at adjectives. We will look at developing characters, setting, and plot ideas in our written work. We will look at how description in text can help us comprehend the text better. When an author writes a text with a description structure, the author uses descriptive details, examples, and reasons to support the main idea. We will be working on fluency with cloze partner reading this week, as well as, antiphonal reading.

Our words of the week are: frontier, flaunt, terminology, and digit.

We will have our spelling dictation on Thurs. Nov. 16th.

**Social Studies** - We will continue our unit - "Why is there French on my cereal box?" We will be looking at the fact that the Bible is central to the culture of the Christian school and classroom and will also begin to look at what government has to do with culture and how government is a gift from God.

Science - We will continue our unit - "Fearfully and Wonderfully Made" where we will look at cellular metabolism and how materials move in and out of a cell. We will also look at why we breathe and what happens in the lungs. Art - We will look at shape and form and will work on taking a 2-D image and making it 3-D.

**Health** - We will continue our Healthy Eating unit. We will be looking specifically at food in the media and the role that the media plays in influencing us in our nutrition choices.

**Cursive Snack** - Nadine is on for our cursive snack and teaching Bb on Nov. 14th. Zachary will be next on Nov. 21st with letter Cc.

**Book in the Box** - Please encourage your child to continue to read their story for book in the box. Books need to be completed by the end of the month.

**Teaching Video** - Thank you for all working with me on this assignment and working through technical difficulties and glitches. We will continue to work through these issues to make future projects even smoother. I appreciate your efforts!

#### Grade 5/6- Mr. Boelens

Math: Grade 5 will continue to learn more about addition, subtraction, and rounding. Grade 6 will investigate integers. Daily work is assigned.

Gym: We are progressing in our skills and control of the volleyball. Monday we will work on serving and setting again, after which we will play a short game.

#### Grade 7/8 Science- Ms. VanKampen: Water Systems

This week we are concluding this particular science unit. The plan: Firstly, to carry out *hands-on experimentation* with various filtering media to filter 'dirty' water and obtain as clean a sample as possible. Students will [briefly] present their discoveries. Secondly, looking at Water Technology Innovations including *desalination and bioremediation*.

#### Grade 7/8 Math- Mr. Boelens

Math: With our ratios unit behind us, we start working with fractions. We are comparing, ordering, simplifying, adding and subtracting them. Daily work continues to be assigned.

#### Grade 7/8- Mrs. Vogel

Welcome to another short week! I look forward to having time to reflect on our parent teacher conferences and the work that each student has completed this term while I write report cards this week.

Scholastic Orders (good Christmas gifts :) ) are due on November 30. There are a number of books online that are not listed in the catalogue so I encourage you to take a look online too if you are looking for specific books for your children. Class code is RC177130.

**Bible:** We are looking at Jewish feasts and festivals that were celebrated every year. Last week we looked at the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. This week we will be exploring Feast of Weeks/Shavuot.

Writing: We are finishing up our Remembrance Day work this week. The assignment with the minimum/maximum for each option are on google writing classroom. Students should proofread their work for spelling and grammar and have a peer proofread their work before turning it in online. This assignment is due Wednesday.

**Guided Reading**: We finally were able to start "The Hobbit"! It was great to get to introduce another class to this classic novel and to work through the first half of the first chapter together. I am looking forward to continuing working on this novel with the class and discovering even more about the book, the author, and the setting from where this book came. This week, we will be finishing chapter 1 and working on chapter 2 and 3 with questions and a chapter quiz throughout the week. We will be doing them together this week to ensure understanding of the process and what my expectations are, so no need to panic this week.

W.W.W.: New sorts will be introduced today. wenolikespelling are working on sort 35, Minions - sort 51, Brutus - sort 55, GOATS - 36?, Bob - 20, and Fall - 4.

**History:** We looked at Acadia and the Exportation of the Acadians last week. This week, we will be delving into The Seven Years' War and the Treaties that came after.

Healthy Living: We focused heavily on health for the first 2 months this year and will be using our health time as a period where we can focus on organization, interpersonal, and community minded skills.

**Music:** We continue to work towards our Christmas music goal. Encourage your child(ren) to practice 10 min. a day when possible. A reminder that band is on Monday and Thursday. Clarinets and Percussion will have sectionals this week. I will be in contact with them about when exactly those will happen. We are also working together as a class to learn the lyrics and actions for the musical. That will be our focus for memory work for this month and December. All students are expected to learn the songs, regardless of their role in the musical.

French: We are continuing to learn about hockey through readings and answering questions. We will be moving on to some more writing and details about the NHL this week.

Art: Remembrance Day Posters are due on Wednesday. The details for this assignment can be found on google art classroom. We are also working on mannequin art and maybe something for the bazaar if plans line up. Stay tuned for more information if that does go forward.
