Kindergarten

Junion Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda

This week we will begin a new theme, Love. We will talk about how God loves us and how we can show love by being kind to others.

In **language**, we will be practicing rhyme recognition, we will listen for the first sound we hear in a group of words or a sentence, and we will continue to practice blending parts of a word.

Our mystery letter last week was letter O! What will it be this week?

In our **Handwriting Without Tears** workbook, we will be printing letters G and S.

In **math,** we will be exploring mass and talking about heavier and lighter. We have a new focus number this month, number 6. Our new focus shape is the heart and our focus colour is pink.

In **Bible**, we will continue to learn about the life of Jesus and read about when he healed a man who was deaf and a man who couldn't walk.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we are saying and listening for the letter **Bb** sound at the beginning and ending of a word. We are blending, segmenting and rhyming words. Some students will be sent home with a high frequency word reader focusing on the word "said" and other students are working on paragraphs in the classroom. If you want books for your child to read at home please let me know.

In **math**, we are learning about the concept of greater than, less than, and equal to with the numbers 1 to 10. Everyday we are looking for numbers that come before another number. This is a tricky concept for SK to learn and understand.

In **Bible**, we will be learning about Moses as a baby and Moses and the burning bush. Our new memory verse is **Exodus 15:2a** "The Lord is my strength and my defense; He has become my salvation."

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we are working on holding a pencil with a tripod grip, printing letters from the top line down to the bottom line and from left to right. We are looking to see if the lowercase letters are above the line(thumbs up), below the line (thumbs down) or between the lines (fist punch) as we learn to use lines in printing. This week we focus on magic "c", letter a, and d.

This week, we will learn about blue jays and cardinals. We are fortunate at LCS to have lots of cardinals around so we will spend some time outside listening and searching for them.

For **health**, we are talking about Friends, what kinds of activities friends do together and what activities do you do by yourself. We are also working on learning our left from our right side of the body and focusing on spatial awareness.

As we are getting ready to go outside, I will be taking some extra time to encourage your child to zip up their coat, or at least try. Once they have tried, I will assist them. Perhaps if you have time at home, you could encourage the same practice.

Language: In our UFLI lessons we will be working with the voiced ch sound.


In our **Handwriting without tears** book we will be practicing printing the letter Bb.


Bible: We are working on Abram and Sarai's journey right now.


Math: We have finished our adding and subtracting unit. We will review a bit and then have a test on Thursday.

Grade 5/6 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Bible - We will continue our unit on the Triumphal Entry through Passover.

Memory Work - "For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." 25 In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26" Due: Wed. Feb. 14th

Language - We will continue to look at articles and pronouns in grammar. In writing, we will work on using topic sentences and paragraphs. We will specifically work on writing pieces related to our Wonder novel study. We will practice our reading comprehension through our Wonder novel study by using a variety of strategies to answer questions related to the text. We will continue to work on fluency and expression with choral, echo, and partner reads of five minute mysteries this week, where we will also work on our deductive reasoning and inferencing skills. Our words of the week will also be tied to our novel study Wonder, where we closely examine unknown or less common words, such as, precept, stampede, mortality, fashionista, catastrophe and flaky. We will also work on completing our language-based MAP testing.

Spelling - Next test will be on Feb. 9th. Please watch your child's agenda for nightly review assignments.

Social Studies - We will wrap up our unit looking at the fur trade in New France and will also look at language and what led to bilingualism.

Science -We will lead the grade ones in some physical activities this week to put our findings on body systems into practice. We will also take time to review the concepts and body systems covered in this unit. Unit test will be on Thursday. Watch for a study guide coming home on Tuesday.

Art - We will continue to look at texture as we create our own Eric Carle animal collage pictures.

Health - We will continue our unit on Mental Health and will be looking specifically of the stigma that is often attached to mental health and what we can do to end stigmas.

<u>Grade 5/6 French - Madame Van Kampen:</u>

We will continue our study of the verb ALLER with sentence construction and translations. A unit project will hopefully get underway this week.



Grade 5/6 Math - Ms. Van Kampen:

Grade 6 is writing a Number Sense unit test today focusing on multiplication and division.

MAP testing is planned for Thursday's class.

Both grades will also be starting the next unit on <u>Measurement</u>:

Grade 5 will be dealing with linear measurement including unit conversion (millimetres, centimetres, and metres) as well as telling time.

Grade 6 will be dealing with linear measurement including unit conversion (kilometres, decametres, metres, decimetres, centimetres, and millimetres), mass (kilograms & grams) and calculations of perimeter.





Grade 7/8 Science - Ms. Van Kampen:

Our unit on The Cell will be concluding this week. Tuesday's class will include a test on the microscope's parts, functions, proper care and use, and preparation & viewing of slides. Our last topic for this unit: "Tissues, Organs, and Organ Systems".

Grade 7/8 Math - Mr. Boelens:

Both classes are working through their data management units.

Grade 7 will complete their enrichment graphs and Lesson 5-5 on Monday and 5-6 on Friday.

Grade 8 will tackle circle graphs on Monday and a review worksheet on Friday.

We will do our math MAP test on Wednesday. We will target to complete these units with a test next week.
