# Kindergarten

### Junion Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda

Happy Easter everyone! Our art project in JK this week will help us remember that Jesus is risen!

For the month of April the JK class will have a spring theme. We will be learning about flowers and seeds and caterpillars and butterflies.

This week we will have some fine motor activities that are all about flowers

In **language**, we will be practicing rhyme recognition, blending, and phoneme isolation. Our mystery letter last week was letter Z. What will our letter be this week?

In our **Handwriting Without Tears** workbook, we will be tracing our last letters Y and Z, and then we will be reviewing all of the uppercase letters.

In **Math**, we will be talking about helpful numbers 5 and 10 and look at what those numbers look like on five and ten frames. Our new focus number is 8, our shape is the star, and our colours are purple and brown.

In **Bible**, we will continue to follow the Easter story and read about Jesus' arrest, Peter's denial, the cross, and the resurrection. Our new memory verse for April is **Luke 24:6** "He is not here; he has risen!" Our new song for April is "I've got the Joy, Joy, Joy, Joy Down in my Heart".

In **Health**, we will learn more about our sense of taste. We will taste some items that are sweet, salty, sour, and bitter.

Please remember to send in **library books every Tuesday**. Students can choose new books but can only take them home if they have returned their books from the previous week. Otherwise, they will remain in their cubbies.

As the temperature and weather conditions continue to change, please remember to send in splash pants and also to return any extra clothes that have come home. Thanks!

### Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

Happy Easter! My prayer is that you have had a wonderful weekend celebrating our risen Saviour!

We will begin Tuesday morning with our own celebration by making Resurrection Rolls. Ask your child how they tasted and why they were called Resurrection Rolls.

This week, we will wrap up our lesson on the letter Kk which sounds like a "C" by highlighting K's in a comprehension passage, blending and segmenting words and spelling words that begin or end with the "C" sound.

In our **Handwriting Without Tears** book, we will focus on how to print a lowercase "K" and copy words in a sentence. We are focused on where the letter is on a line.

In **math**, we will wrap up our addition to 5 unit and will continue on with addition to 10. Students are encouraged to print the numbers in the correct orientation.

In **Bible**, we will celebrate Jesus' Resurrection and learn that 40 days later he ascended into heaven. We will discuss what that means for us as believers. This is our last week for **John 3:16**.

We will begin talking about the season of Spring and how it differs from the Winter season.

On **Thursday**, SK will participate in the Dental Screening. The public health dental hygienists usually count the students' teeth, reward our brave students with a sticker and card with the number of teeth they have. If there are any dental concerns, they will be in touch with you. If you have any concerns about them looking at your child's teeth please let me or the office know.

As we continue our unit on La Famille, we will be learning about Les Adjectifs [adjectives] and their use to describe oneself and the members of one's family.



### Grade 5/6 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

**Bible** - We will conclude our unit on Jesus' Death. Unit test will be on Friday. Please watch for a study guide coming home later this week.

**Memory Work** - "Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. John 14:6" Due: Friday Apr. 5th

Language - In writing, we will work on elaborating our ideas, including details, and extending our writing. We will also work on including proper punctuation and adding paragraphs to our writing. In grammar, we are looking at pronouns. We will continue to practice our reading comprehension through our Wonder novel study by using a variety of strategies to answer questions related to the text. We will also look at how an author may use a compare-and-contrast text structure to write an informational text. Our words of the week will also be tied to our novel study Wonder, where we closely examine unknown or less common words, such as, defective, giddy, horrific and syndrome. We will also begin a children's literature battle of the books to work on our fluency and oral communication.

**Spelling** - Please watch your child's agenda for nightly review assignments. Our spelling tests will be on Friday Apr. 12th.

We will look at a variety of different aspects of the Canadian provinces including populations, when they joined confederation, where they are located, their size, and their flags. Students are working on group presentations and will teach their peers about each aspect listed above.

**Science** - We will continue our unit called Space Declares. This week we will be looking at Terrestrial and Gas Giant Planets, as well as, how are the planets arranged in our solar system, what is the role of the Sun in the solar system is, and the distances between the planets using about 5 metres of wall space to display the solar system. We will also conclude our look into the Challenger disaster.

**Art** - We will continue working on our 3-D word art. We will be making both a colour and black and white version to compare and contrast how that affects the mood of a piece.

**Health** - We dive deeper and extend our study on Mental Health. We are looking specifically at emotions and strategies to use when experiencing different emotions. We will also continue to explore the zone of regulation and become familiar with figuring out what zone our emotions fit in at different times throughout the day.
