As we were blessed with Mademoiselle Klumpenhower's teaching in the past two weeks, this week we will finish our Adjectives & Etre unit. Students will be reading their descriptive compositions to me; these compositions will be assessed for writing and reading. We will also spend some time on review of the four irregular verbs learned this year: AVOIR, ETRE, FAIRE, and ALLER.



Grade 5/6 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Bible - We will continue our unit on the Pentecost. We will focus on Acts 1-6 this week.

Memory Work - Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Language - In writing, we are working on creative story writing and editing, using the CUPS acronym. In grammar, we are continuing to review pronouns. To work on our reading comprehension we will look at how an author may use a compare-and-contrast text structure to write an informational text. We will also answer literally comprehension questions about the text we are reading. We will have our children's literature battle of the books finals.

Spelling - Please watch your child's agenda for nightly review assignments. Our spelling tests will be on Friday May 10th.

Art - We will conclude our work with plasticine to create textured landscapes. We will also begin our Mother's Day creations.

Health - We will continue to work on Mindfulness. Looking specifically at developing compassion, setting positive intentions, and taking care of ourselves.

French: We are doing a mini unit on numbers quickly and will then be working on a cafe unit.

<u>Grade 7/8 Science - Ms. Van Kampen:</u>

We will conclude our unit on Systems in Action this week. Students have been working steadily on their Rube Goldberg machines, altering and adjusting components so as to [hopefully] achieve their selected end task. It is a time of experimentation and while frustrations may occur along the way, students are encouraged to persevere and recognize the challenges of design and acquiring the skills of hands-on problem solving.

Tuesday's double-period will be the final work block and demonstrations will also occur for final assessment.

Our next and final unit will be Fluids.

Grade 7/8 Math - Mr. Boelens:

This Friday, we will take our math MAP test. Next week Wednesday, many of our Grade 7-8 students will participate in the Gauss Contest. This is offered as a math challenge through the University of Waterloo. Thanks to Woodland Christian High School who pays for our participation fees.

This week, the **Grade 7s** will continue algebra by simplifying expressions and solving equations. **Grade 8s** will be finishing up their algebra unit with solving algebraic equations.

There is a test scheduled for next week Friday. As always, there is lots of daily work assigned.
