From the Principal's Desk

Our theme chapel on Friday focused on Community Building. It is our desire that students will be active pursuers and builders of communal shalom. Our classrooms will be communities of grace where students will walk and work together in a spirit of shalom.

Robert Alan, a writer, expressed it this way, "In our hectic, fast-paced, consumer-driven society, it's common to feel overwhelmed, isolated and alone. Many are re-discovering the healing and empowering role that community can bring to our lives. The sense of belonging we feel when we make the time to take an active role in our communities can give us a deeper sense of meaning and purpose.'

Our students can be active pursuers and builders of community in their classrooms, their neighbourhoods and in the global village they are part of. In fact, they need to be. Community is how God made us, since doing life without other people is not an option. Shalom (from Hebrew) - is more than just 'not fighting'. The word we most often use instead of shalom is peace, but that doesn't quite describe the whole concept—it is more like fullness or completeness – how God intended things to be. One of clearest and most well-known Biblical metaphors compares Christian community to a body which is made up of many parts. We need all the parts to work together in order to experience health and wholeness.

We all know that maintaining a healthy body isn't something that just happens by itself. Attention must be paid to what we put into our body, how active we are and how we manage stress. Students need to learn and experience that community doesn't just happen either. We need to pursue shalom. We can't just wait for community and peace to come to us - we must go out and make it happen. We need to build shalomto be active and eager examples of peaceful/shalom-filled communities. -adapted from Teaching for Transformation Throughline Descriptions

Students in *grades 3-8* are able to participate in cross country! If students are interested, they can sign up with Mrs. Delleman. We will start practices on Tuesday. In order to make the team, students will need to be able to complete their distances, running the whole time, by the end of September.

We had a great first week of school! I am enjoying getting to know the students in the class and watching them interact with each other.

This week we will begin to look at the letters in our names and talk about the beginning sounds of each of our names. We will also begin to learn about words that rhyme.

In **math** we will be learning about same and different. We will learn to group objects that are the same colour, and also recognize which object in a group is different. This month we will be learning about the square, the colour red, and the numbers 0 and 1.

We have begun our first **Bible** unit on Creation. Last week we learned about the first two days of creation, and this week we will continue to learn about the next days of creation when God created plants, and the sun, moon and stars.

Grade 1

Grade 1 - Ms. Denhartog:

What an amazing first week at school! It feels good getting into a routine after summer holidays. We have been full of energy, curiosity of God's world and enthusiasm for learning.

Bible: Our Bible unit for September is all about the world God made. We started by talking about how God created the earth and it all started as darkness. Our unit will show how much care God took to create our earth and how much he loves us. Our unit will end with the story of Noah and the flood at the end of the month.

Memory work: For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not have all the same function, so in Christ, we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. Romans 12:4-5. This is the verse that the whole school is learning together. We will practice it in class, but please take the time with your family to learn this verse together at home.

Math: We jumped right into our Jump math books at the end of our first week. This week we will continue looking at sorting attributes and reviewing our numbers 1-10.

Language: In our Phonics program this week we will start listening for the beginning sounds of simple words. In our printing book we will be reviewing our corner capital letters. In our UFLI program this week we are starting with review from kindergarten of all our letters and the sounds they make. In our Handwriting without Tears book we will start this week with practicing corner capital letters.

Social Studies: We are starting our unit titled "My Local Community". In this unit we will start by looking at different natural and built features. Throughout this unit we will discuss the different parts that make up our community and at the end of the unit we will look at different maps and gain some skills in using a map.

Health: Last week we started our first health lesson on Zones of Regulation. Our word of the month for September in health is "regulation or regulate". We have been practicing how we can regulate our body to help us feel comfortable in the space we are in. The students have been showing me how they regulate when they are warm by taking off their sweater or how they regulate their thirst by getting a drink of water. As a class we regulate our wiggly bodies by doing a brain break dance.

Gym: In Gym we will play lots of different games that will help us practice safety in the gym as well as showing active participation.

Show and Tell: Every Friday we will have a few students who will have a chance to bring something for show and tell. For the month of September, the theme of show and tell is "something that is special to you or an item that begins with the first letter of your name." Please help your child find an appropriate item that fits the theme. Your child will be asked to share a few facts or details about what they brought to share, please practice so they are confident to share with the class.

Grade 2

Grade 2 - Mrs. Grundlingh:

What a privilege to get to know a new group of students. I am looking forward to teach and see them grow this year. Here is an outline of their work with me for this week:

Math - Number sense: We are working on numbers 1-10 for the month of September.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week we start the introduction of our key concepts of our sound wall and the 44 phonemes of spoken English. There are no phonics homework going home this week yet.

Social studies: This week we start our unit on "Changing Family & Community Traditions" by looking at what traditions are and also who our ancestors were.

Bible: We are focusing on the book of James that encourages Christians to live in a way that is consistent with their faith. We are looking at how to live a Christian life that ties in nicely with our theme of Community Building for the month of September. Our memory verse for this month is 1 Corinthians 12:12: 12 *Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ*.

Library: We have our first library for the year tomorrow. They get to read the books for a week and then return them to the library the following week. If they return their books, they can either renew it or get 2 new books. Please encourage them to develop the habit of bringing their books to school every Tuesday, even if they would just like to renew it.

Thank you for an awesome first week of school last week! It was great to get to know the students and I am looking forward to continuing our journey of learning together! This week we will be diving into our subjects and beginning some new units.

Bible - This week we are continuing our Unit on 1 Peter. Our memory work is 1 Peter 1:3-6 and will be due on **Friday**, **September 20th**.

Memory Work: 3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, 5 who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. 6 In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. 1 Peter 1:3-6

Science - This week, we are beginning our unit on Rocks and Minerals! If you have any special rocks at home, feel free to bring them to school on Thursday, with parent's permission.

Language - This week, we are reviewing our spelling words, working on our independent reading, and will be working on writing with the Daily 5.

Spelling Words: answer, question, backpack, library, Tenorio, classroom, Bible, creation, worship, enjoy, servant, discover, beauty

Social Studies - We are continuing our unit on Government during Social Studies this week. We will also have our first Auction coming up on Friday!

Auction - A letter was sent out early last week to provide information about our class auctions. Please let me know if you would like me to send it again. Please bring one item to 'sell' that has been pre-approved by your parents for Friday.

Grade 5 - Math - Mr. Tenorio:

Before starting our unit one we will learn about some ancient numeral systems from Egypt, Mexico, Babilon and we are learning how the Romans use letters instead of numbers and how we still use them for counting centuries or to signify annual events such as the Super Bowl.



Grade 6 & 7 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

It's hard to believe we are already stepping into the second week of school! I guess it is like the old saying says, "time flies when you are having fun!" Our first week was filled with joy, energy, procedure learning, and a growing our classroom community. I am truly enjoying getting to know each of the students better with each passing day. Their unique personalities and gifts are already shining through.

I've been especially encouraged by the initiative and passion your children are showing in embracing our school theme Mission Possible. It's clear they're committed to spreading God's light with enthusiasm and sincerity. It's a beautiful thing to witness and be a part of, and I'm excited to see how their hearts continue to grow in faith and kindness throughout the year.

Thank you for all your support as we embark on this journey together. I'm looking forward to all that's ahead! Your child should have brought a contact card home last week with all of my contact information. Please reach out with any questions or concerns you may have over the year.

Facebook - I have started a class Facebook page called LCS Grade Six/Seven. This is a private group for current Grade Six/Seven parents/guardians only and will be a place for me to share daily work examples, reminders, and pictures of our learning. Please note I will not be posting any pictures until I have received back all permission forms, so please complete your form ASAP, and return by Mon. Sept. 16th. so I can begin to share our learning with you.

Language - In reading we will be working on sequencing. We will look at how an author may use a sequence text structure to write an informational text, and how the author describes details in the order they happen. In writing we will be working on writing "I Am" poems and will also begin to look at procedural writing. In grammar we will be reviewing nouns, verbs and adjectives. In fluency we will be applying a variety of different reading strategies to our shared reading of the "Terry Fox" text. In spelling we will be completing our spelling inventories. Watch for spelling lists coming home starting next week. In vocabulary expansion we will be learning the meaning and usage of the words: array, promotion, reluctant, and confront.

Bible - We will continue to work on our Mission Possible project and will also begin to look at the Fruit of the Spirit, looking specifically at Love and Joy this week. Our memory work for this month is: "For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not have all the same function, so in Christ, we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. Romans 12:4-5"

Science - This week we will begin a new unit on Flight. We will begin by specifically looking at what flight is and the history of flight.



Grade 6 & 7 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Health - We will be working on the Zones of Regulation, learning to identify different emotions by their zone, figuring out what our triggers and sparks are, and beginning to develop our personal regulation toolboxes.

Art – We are starting the year with personality cubes, which allow us to explore a variety of mediums while getting to know each other better.

Library - We will have library every week on Wednesdays. Please remind your child to pack their books.

Soccer - Just a reminder that soccer practices will be after school on Tues. and Thurs. for the boys until 4:30, and on Wed. for the girls until 4:15.

Grade 6 & 7 - Math - Mr. Tenorio:

<u>Grade 6 & 7 - History/Geography/Social Studies - Mrs. Vogel:</u>

As the students enter the higher grades, social studies transforms into history and geography as separate subjects. Students will have either history or geography units happening. We are starting the year off with a history unit but before we get to that we are doing a short mapping unit to remind ourselves of where we live in our world and in Canada. The students have already worked on a map of the world which is due this week Thursday. After that, we will work on a map of Canada and reviewing the locations and capitals of our countries provinces and territories.

Band: Students will not get their instruments this week yet, we will be reviewing notes and what they remember of music reading this week. Next week I hope to have instruments ready for them and for them to bring joyful noise home when they practice.

Grade 7/8

Grade 7/8 - Mrs. Vogel:

Welcome back to another year! Grade 8, I'm looking forward to another year with you of learning and experiences, grade 7, while it may be different from last year for you, you will soon feel like you are part of the class and understand the expectations and how our class works. Please feel free to ask questions, make mistakes, and maybe not get too messy:).

A couple things: We have agendas again this year. For the time being, all students should be bringing them home every evening and getting them signed by you, they should return the next day where I will sign them as well while checking to make sure they have written down their homework.

Students also have a green homework folder that they will bring home on Friday with anything they have had marked and that has been handed back. Please sign each assignment so I know you have seen it and send the folder back on Monday.

The schedule is a little different this year as I have taken on the role of Vice Principal and therefore I only have the privilege of starting with the class on Monday, but I spend some time every day with them for which I am thankful. I have put a copy of the schedule on Google Classroom Homeroom where every student can access it and you can print off a copy or copy it to your own schedule if that is helpful for you.

Writing: We are starting with some grammar review and warm up writing exercises just to get back in the swing of things writing wise.

Working With Words: We will start with our assessments this week and our units next week. Students will be placed in groups according to their ability level as shown on the assessments completed this week.

Guided Reading: We have started our first unit learning about short stories through the theme of Building Community. We have started reading our first story and will finish that this week while looking at point of view as well.

History: We have completed a map of the world (due today) and will be working on a map of Canada, which will be due next Monday.

Band: Students can expect to get their instruments by the end of this week or at the very latest, our first class next week. More to come.

Grade 7 & 8 - Mr. Tenorio:

Math: Before starting our unit one we will learn about some ancient numeral systems from Egypt, Mexico, Babilon and we are learning how the Romans use letters instead of numbers and how we still use them for counting centuries or to signify annual events such as the Super Bowl. Adding in this class a little introduction of the Binary system that we use in computers.

Bible: We will be reading a daily Proverb and this week we will read from chapters 2-6.

Science: We are Learning about buildings and forces and we will try to build one with secret materials.
