# Classroom News Junior Kindergarten

### Junion Kindergarten A - Mrs. Baarda

Welcome to a new week!

**Tuesday** is picture day. Students will all have their photo taken on Tuesday morning and we will have a class photo taken as well. You will receive information from the office about how to order pictures if you choose to do so.

**Thursday** is the special hot dog day fundraiser that the Grade 6/7 class is doing for ChildCan. Students who ordered hot dogs will receive them at lunch.

Thursday is also a spirit day when we can dress in gold or vellow to raise awareness about childhood cancer.

Last week we started our class jobs. Every day each student will have a small job to do to help out in our carpet time or in the class (point at the letters while we sing the alphabet, line leader, lights helper, etc.) Students are very excited to know what their job will be each day!

This week in language we will practice rhyming, listening for initial sounds in words, and blending words. We will also continue to practice recognizing the letters in the alphabet while singing the alphabet song.

We have begun to work in our **Handwriting Without Tears** workbooks! We begin by practicing to aim and colour shapes on the page. I will be focusing on helping students use a correct pencil grip.

Next week we will begin to focus on one "Mystery" letter each week. We will learn the sound and the Jolly Phonics song that goes with the letter. We will also do some activities to help us recognize that letter in its upper and lowercase forms.

In **Math** we will be sorting information into different groups (making graphs) to compare which group has more.

In **Bible** we will complete our first unit about "The Beginning of the World" by reading about Noah, the Ark and the Flood.

In Health we will begin talking about feelings: happy, sad, afraid and angry.

We will learn that God created us all to have feelings, that they may not be the same as someone else's feelings and that feelings can change often.

**Library** day is **Tuesday**, please remember to send in last week's books so students can take home their new choices.

### Junion Kindergarten B- Mrs. Casadio:

This week our class has been focusing on things that make us special and what gifts/talents God has given each of us. We stamped our fingerprints and examined them to see how each one of us is different!

Our student of the week was Clara, she was always ready to help out in any way she could!

In language we've continued learning about rhyming words, focusing on words that have the sound "at", "in" and "ot" at the end of the word. Our letter this week is "B". We've learned what sound the letter "B" makes and talked about different words that start with that letter. We've also been practicing how to hold a crayon/pencil and we've learned a song called "the crayon song" to help us remember.

In math we have continued with our counting, and practicing writing the numbers 0 and 1 on a chalkboard.

In Bible we have learned Genesis 1:24-26 and Genesis 2:1-17. Learning how God created land animals, humans and rest.

In **health** we are talking about different ways we are unique and special and how we can honor God with the gifts and talents He's given us.

Next week we are going to start diving into all things fall, and we are going to start learning how two different words can form one word when they are put together.

Don't forget that **Tuesday** morning we have **library** so please be sure to bring back your library books every week so you can get out a new one!

# Senior Kindergarten

### Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

We have had another great week of getting to know each other. We are learning each other's names and really focusing on looking at the person you are talking to.

This week **TUESDAY** is **PICTURE DAY!** How exciting! Come dressed for your school picture. A class photo will be taken on Tuesday only, not on retake day.

On **Thursday** please send your child wearing something **gold** or **yellow** or sparkly in support of **Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.** We remember Georgia and Katherine whom we lost to childhood cancer. If you ordered hotdogs, we will be served by Grade 6/7 on Thursday as well.

This week we will focus on the sound of letter m. "M" is a continuous sound that can be stretched out, practice this with your child. Who can keep the sound going the longest?

We will be reading our room as we review the word "the". Point this word out to your child if you are reading a story together or the Bible. It is good for them to see it in a variety of contexts.

In **math**, we are learning about counting one item by one item to 5 and printing numbers 1 to 5.

In **Bible**, we will wrap up our first unit about Creation. Ask your child what God said after each day he created. (It was good) After God made man, he said "It is very good".

We continue working on our All About Me unit.

In **printing**, we are really focusing on proper pencil grip and printing letters from top to bottom, not bottom to top.

On **Monday September 30th, 2024**, we will have a story called "Today is Orange Shirt Day" by Phyllis Webstad and Natassia Davies. Students are welcome to wear orange that day but it is not mandatory.

### **Grade 1 - Ms. Denhartog:**

**Bible**: This week in Bible we are focusing on finishing up our unit and concluding with the story of Noah and the flood. This story is important because it shows God's care and faithfulness. God cared for Noah and his family, and after the flood He promised to never flood the whole earth again and He gave the symbol of a rainbow.

**Memory work**: For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not have all the same function, so in Christ, we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. Romans 12:4-5. This is memory work that the whole school is learning together. We will practice it in class, but please take the time with your family to learn this verse together at home.

**Math**: This week we are focusing on using the word "more". We will be looking at pictures and numbers and using our skills to find out which is more.

Language: In our Phonics program this week we will continue listening for the beginning sounds of simple words. In our printing book we will be reviewing our center capital letters. In our UFLI program this week we will be working with the nasalized "a" sound. In the kid mailbag you will find our decodable story from last week. Please take time with your child each night to have them read through it. It is great practice to get into a habit of reading each night. In mid October we will start a home reading program. Our UFLI decodable stories will still be sent home during that time as well.

**Spelling words**: ran, pan, ham, can, jam, am (Please practice these words with your child)

**Heart words** (words we just have to learn by heart): the, I, a, said (keep practicing these heart words).

**Social Studies**: This week we will continue talking about built and natural features. We will also introduce the words urban and rural.

**Show and Tell**: Every Friday we will have a few students who will have a chance to bring something for show and tell. For the month of September, the theme of show and tell is "something that is special to you or an item that begins with the first letter of your name." Please help your child find an appropriate item that fits the theme. Your child will be asked to share a few facts or details about what they brought to share, please practice so they are confident to share with the class. **Friday Sept 27: Timothy, Michael, Ruby, Isaiah, Kaylee, Karissa, Serena**

**Library**: Our library day is **Wednesday** this year. Please have your child bring their library books back Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday- so they can pick out new books!

# Grade 2

### **Grade 2 - Mrs. Grundlingh:**

Tomorrow is **picture day**! Here is an outline of their work with me for this week:

**Math - Number sense**: We are still working on numbers 1-10 for the month of September.

**Phonics, spelling and reading:** This week we are reviewing the letter A and the nasalized A (an, am). Please look at the homework practice sheet going home today. I will send an email explaining it as well. Starting this week we will do 2 sounds every week. Please use these sheets to support your child's learning at home.

**Social studies**: We continue our unit on "Changing Family & Community Traditions" and focus on generations.

**Bible**: We continue our unit on the Old Testament and take a look at creation this week. Our memory verse for the whole school for the month of September is Romans12:4-5: "For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not have all the same function, so in Christ, we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others"

**Library**: We have library tomorrow. They are allowed to borrow 2 library books at a time. If they return their books tomorrow, they can either renew it or get 2 new books. Please encourage them to develop the habit of bringing their books to school every Tuesday, even if they would just like to renew it.

### Grade 2 - Mrs. Kuipers:

**Agendas**- A reminder that spelling words and important due dates will be added to your child's agenda each week and sometimes daily. Please check and initial each day.

**Remind**- If you haven't joined Remind yet, you're missing out on fun class pictures and updates. Please get the app and sign up with our class code.

**Science** - A mini animal project came home last week. It is due this Wednesday. Students will be sharing their fun facts with the class on Thursday. We look forward to learning about some of God's amazing creatures!

**Math** - We wrapped up our Patterns unit last week with a quiz that will be returned this week and project of a patterned snake! Ask your child what the 'core' of the pattern they created is and how it changed (colour, direction of squares, detail design,etc.). This week we will be exploring linear measurement. To extend your child's learning at home, have them measure how tall everyone in the family is, compare whose shoes are longer, or measure and compare the width of different story books at home.

**Spelling**- I could tell that many students practiced their spelling tests last week! Well done to those who did. I encourage everyone to keep practicing each week. This week's focus is on the 'short' a and 'nasal' a. The \*star\* words are our 'heart' words for the week - words that are important but do not follow typical patterns of spelling.

**Red & Yellow Group**: sat, mad, mat, tag, ham, man, pan, ran, \*have. \*the

**Blue Group**: past, scab, glad, fast, trap, swam, land, pant, ramp, \*have



### Grade 3 - Mrs. Claus

This morning, I walked into the classroom and was greeted by our bean and pea plants! Every single cup that we planted seeds in has grown! Some are taller, and some are just starting to grow. This reminds me of the growth we see in our students. Some shoot up very quickly, and others take their time, but they are all growing. God made them all just the way they are supposed to be.

**Bible**: Most of us know our memory work. There are a few that need extra practice at home. We will continue to recite it every morning. We have completed our first unit and will review today and have a quiz on Wednesday.

**Math**: We are learning about pattern rules and patterns in tables this week.

**Language**: This week, there will be a huge focus on our penmanship. Students must form their letters correctly to prevent reversals and make them legible. We will also review digraphs this week.

**Science**: Our study of plants continues as we become more familiar with the different parts of a flower.

**French**: On Thursday, students will have a little quiz on colours and numbers from 1-10. They need to be able to read the words associated with each colour and number to ten.

### **Grade 4 - Mrs. Delleman:**

**Math** - We have finished a Math unit on number sense. Students will have a quiz on THURSDAY. On Wednesday night the Smartboard notes on what we have learned in class will be sent to parents to help students review for the quiz. Students will need to know place value, base ten blocks, expanded form, comparing, ordering, and rounding.

I Know It - Students were introduced to the I Know It website (<a href="www.iknowit.com">www.iknowit.com</a>) last week and practiced logging onto their accounts today in class. Their first assignment is due FRIDAY and is on rounding. The class code AND password are lcs12345, and their username is their first and last name (no capitals, no spaces). If you have trouble logging on, or would like a teaching video on rounding sent to help students with the assignment, please email me.

**Memory Work** - This year we are working on memory work as a whole school. The following verse will need to be memorized by FRIDAY - Romans 12:4-5 - "For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not have the same function, so in Christ, we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others." We have been practicing this verse with actions in our Bible classes.

# Grade 5

### Grade 5 - Mrs. Tenorio:

**Bible** - We completed our memory work last week on 1 Peter 1:3-6 and I hope this verse can be encouragement to your families! This week we are continuing our Unit on 1 Peter. We will have our Unit Test on 1 Peter on *Thursday, October 3, 2024*.

**Memory Work**: Romans 12:4-5 4 "For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, 5 so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others." *Due Wednesday, October 2,* 2024.

**Science** - This week, we are continuing our unit on Rocks and Minerals! Last week we learned about Igneous, Sedimentary and Metamorphic Rocks and we created paper mache Volcanoes. This week we will paint them, watch them explode and start learning about the Rock Cycle.

**Language** - This week, we are continuing to work on our first spelling sorts, splitting into different groups. We will have a dictation *quiz on Thursday, Sept 26*. We will also begin writing letters to complete our mission for the month as community builders. In addition, we will be reading our library books. Library days are on **Wednesdays**.

**Social Studies** - We are continuing our unit on Government during Social Studies this week. Last week's auction was fun and some exciting items were sold. Please bring your pre-approved items for this week's auction on Thursday and Friday.

**Health**: This week during Health class, we will be looking at the nutrition facts and ingredients in our foods from home. Please bring one empty food box, container that contains nutrition facts and ingredients for **Tuesday**, **September 24**. Examples are: a cereal box, cookies box, bag of pasta, jam jar, peanut butter jar, processed foods, etc.

**Reminder**: Please sign your children's agendas each evening, as this is our first method of communication and record of homework.

### <u>Grade 5 - Math - Mr. Tenorio:</u>

We learned about Algebra and how we can apply this in real life problems. This week we will learn about whole numbers and how to compare and represent them in different ways.



### <u>4e Niveau: Madame Van Kampen:</u>

Some great progress was made last week: we counted up to 49 and students wanted to know what 50 is!! Students are showing increased confidence in answering the questions Comment t'appelles-tu? and Comment ca va? We also had the opportunity to play a round of Bingo based upon the numbers 1 through 31. **This week's focus**: days of the week <u>and</u> continuing to recite numbers as far as we can [to 40 for sure!] and matching the spellings with the pronunciation.

### <u>5e Niveau: Madame Van Kampen:</u>

**This week's focus: Grammar**: negation (i.e. using ne....pas), intonation and creating questions; Pronunciation focus A = AH. Petit histoire: La Planète Rectangle.

### <u>6e/7e Niveaux: Madame Van Kampen:</u>

**This week's focus**: each student will be presenting information about him/herself (C'est Moi) during Monday's class. Grammar: possessive adjectives mon/ma/mes (= my), ton/ta/tes (= your), son/sa/ses (=his/her); negation (i.e. using ne...pas)

### 7e/8e Niveaux: Madame Van Kampen:

we have a few students who have yet to complete their C'est Moi presentations. Grammar: We will continue to focus on the use of the possessive adjectives introduced in last week's grammar lesson (mon/ma/mes, ton/ta/tes, son/sa/ses); negation (i.e. using ne....pas); the verb PORTER (=to wear /to carry).

### Grade 6 & 7 - Mr. Tenorio:

**Math:** We will use multiplication and division in Algebra and start solving problems in real life. We will solve some equations in different ways and the students will be able to choose what is easier for them.



### Grade 6 & 7 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

**Weekly Highlights** - We've had an exciting and productive week in the classroom! The students applied their writing skills by crafting detailed "how-to" pieces and then brought those instructions to life by teaching me how to make seed butter and jam sandwiches. It was a fun, hands-on way to connect their learning with a real-world task, and we shared lots of laughs together for this one.

We also continued to work together on our "Mission Possible" ChildCan hot lunch fundraiser. The class came together to problem-solve, communicate, and collaborate as they planned for this important event. It's been amazing to see their teamwork and determination grow as they work toward helping others.

Overall it was a week full of learning, creativity, and community-building!

Language - In reading we will work on how when you read, you may come across unfamiliar vocabulary, but learn to recognize how the clues in a text can help us figure out the word's meaning. In writing we will continue to work on procedural writing and the importance of being clear and specific, as we begin to write our pieces for Teach Your Teacher. In grammar we will be reviewing nouns, verbs and adjectives. In fluency we will continue to apply a variety of different reading strategies to our shared reading of the "Terry Fox" text. In spelling our next test will be on Oct. 4th. Your child should know their assigned group. If in doubt check the list taped into the notes section of their agenda.

# Grade 6 & 7

### Grade 6 & 7 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

**Health** - We will be continue to work on the Zones of Regulation, continuing to learn new regulation tools. We will also be looking at the decision to regulate - exploring metacognitive skills that help us regulate with more independence and agency.

**Art** – We are beginning art sketchbooks alongside a variety of projects. Sketches 6-10 are due Sept. 26th and sketches 11-15 are due Oct. 3rd. Just a reminder that all students have the opportunity to revisit old sketches and try to improve on them based off of the feedback they received. These are working documents. I am love to encourage students that their F.A.I.L. (first attempt in learning) does not need to be their last. Sept. art vocabulary and art history test will be on Oct. 3rd. Just a reminder that study sheets are in your binders and are also posted on Google classroom.

We will continue learning about line this week. We will be exploring the difference between contour lines, cross contour lines and gesture lines. We will also be using lines and colour to create op-art.

**Library** - We will have library every week on Wednesdays. Please remind your child to pack their books.

**ChildCan Hot Lunch** - Just a reminder that Thurs. is our first hotdog hot lunch day.

**Wear Yellow**, **Gold or Sparkles** - On Thursday we will also wear yellow, gold, or sparkles in support of Childhood Cancer.

**Soccer Practices** - Just a reminder that soccer practices will be after school on Tues. and Thurs. for the boys until 4:30, and on Wed. for the girls until 4:15.
