Junior Kindergarten

Junior Kindergarten A - Mrs. Baarda

Happy Thanksgiving! I pray that you all were blessed this weekend and able to give thanks to God for all of his many gifts to us.

This week we will be exploring apples in our class. We will be painting using apples as stamps. We will also taste different colours of apples and decide which ones we like best.

In **language** we will be listening for beginning sounds, practicing rhyming words, and blending smaller words into a larger word. We will also learn about segmenting words, or breaking them into smaller pieces.

Last week our mystery letter was **Aa**. We learned the Jolly Phonics song for letter A and completed a letter find page for upper and lowercase A. We learned words and names that begin with letter A. What will our mystery letter be this week? In our **workbooks** we will begin tracing lines, shapes and the letters **L** and **F**.

In **Math** we will continue to learn about counting, and we will practice counting up to, and down from 5 and 10.

In **Bible** we will read about Joseph in Egypt. Then we will begin a new unit about "God's Plan for His Family" and learn about Miriam and Moses. This month we will be practicing two memory verses, **Genesis 28:15a**, and **Psalms 89:1**. We will practice these verses together as a group each day, I will not test students on memory verses.

In **Health** we will continue to learn about emotions. We will talk about feeling sad this week and what helps us when we feel sad.

Tuesday is library day. Please send in last week's books so students can take home their new choices.

As the weather changes and becomes cooler, please consider sending your child in splash pants and warm outdoor clothes for the morning recesses. Children are outside before school begins in the morning when it can be quite chilly still.

Junior Kindergarten B- Mrs. Casadio:

Happy Thanksgiving!

I hope you all had a wonderful weekend surrounded by loved ones.

Our student of the week was Abby! She was always eager to help out in any way she could :)

In **language**, we continued to learn how we can blend two words together to make one big word and we also listened to new sounds and discussed whether they were the same or different. Our letter of the week was the letter **"E"**.

In our **"Learning without Tears"** handwriting books we have been continuing colouring objects by their assigned colours.

In **math** we have been guessing whether or not certain items will fit into our square box. We have also been practicing sorting items from biggest to smallest.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

I hope everyone enjoyed Thanksgiving this weekend. I am thankful that I have your child in my class. I love watching them grow.

This week we will continue our work with the sound of the letter **Tt**, and review the sounds of letters **s**, **m** and **a**. We work with rhyming words and breaking words into syllables and blending letter sounds together to read words.

In **Math**, we are working on the concept of the same and greater than, counting to 20 and printing numbers to 6.

We will begin learning about apples and how God created them with seeds inside so that we can always have apples.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we will continue to practice proper pencil grip. When printing you ALWAYS start from the top and work your way down and move from left to right. It would be very helpful if you notice your child printing letters from the bottom up, if you could correct this. Grade 1 - Ms. Denhartog:

Grade 2

Grade 2 - Mrs. Grundlingh:

I hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving weekend with all your loved ones. I have a short week with the students this week.

Here is an outline of their work with me for this week:

Math - Number sense: We are working on numbers to 20 today.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week we will be working on reviewing all the short sounds in CVC words and the FLSZ spelling rule. Please see the homework practice sheet going home today to help the students practice these phonics. If you have any questions regarding the home practice sheets, please reach out to us.

Social studies: We continue our unit on "Changing Family & Community Traditions". Today we are doing a Venn diagram comparing our families and recording the things that are the same and the things that are different, e.g. how many family members, favourite foods, celebrations, favourite games etc. Thanking God for our unique families.

Bible: We continue our unit on the Old Testament and we will be looking into God's people needing judges and kings. We will have a class bible quiz today. We have reviewed all the work in class and will do it again before we do the quiz. Please see our new memory verse for the month below. Please help your child to learn this memory verse at home as well. ***"Sing to the Lord a new song, for He has done marvelous things; His right hand and His holy arm have worked salvation for him."*** - Psalm 98:1-

Grade 2 - Mrs. Kuipers:

I hope you all had a lovely Thanksgiving. I'm very proud of our class and their commitment to our assembly last week! I hope that you and your children took on the challenge of saying three different things each day that you were thankful for. God has blessed us with so many things and no matter the situation we are in, a grateful heart is one way to worship him.

Math: as a class we are enjoying identifying 2 D shapes and their characteristics. At home encourage your child to name the shapes they see around the house. For example, they may identify that the picture frame is a square. You can ask how they know that it is a square and grade 2 students should be able to explain that a square has 4 equal sides, often 2 vertical and 2 horizontal, and that they have all 'square corners'.

Science: We will soon be wrapping up learning about the growth and changes in animals and moving into a final research project. The work will primarily be done at school but the occasional request to finish something may come home. Please continue to check agendas daily.

As we continue with our Calendar Unit, we will focus on the special days/holidays throughout the calendar year and the four seasons (les saisons). We will continue to put together the daily date.

5e Niveau: Madame Van Kampen:

Some students need yet to complete their accordion-style booklets for *l' Action de grâce* (Thanksgiving). We will continue our focus on the season of l'Automne and incorporate some reading [comprehension] of a simpler, shorter story on one's favourite season as well as a passage on L'Action de grâce.

6e/7e Niveaux: Madame Van Kampen:

For our next unit, Les Vêtements (clothing), we will focus on the pertinent vocabulary (i.e. clothing types and accessories) and determine what is suitable or logical seasonally and for various activities. Use of the verb PORTER (= to wear/to carry) will be continued.

Current unit: Les Vêtements (clothing). This week we will begin our focus on the applicable adjectives for describing clothing (e.g. colours, patterns, fabric types, and overall styles) and the verbs FAIRE (=to do, to make) as it pertains to "shopping" and METTRE (= to put on).
