

<u> Junior Kindergarten A - Mrs. Baarda</u>

We have a shortened week this week due to parent teacher interviews. **FRIDAY** there is **NO SCHOOL**. I look forward to meeting with each of you Thursday afternoon and Friday morning.

This week we will be doing some sponge painting and painting pictures of cars. We will read some stories and sing some songs about transportation.

In **language** we will continue to practice rhyming, listening for initial sounds in names, segmenting words, and the student's favourite - blending words.

Our mystery letter last week was letter **P**. We learned about the sound p makes using the jolly phonics song and talked about what words begin with the letter P. What will our mystery letter be this week?

In **Bible** we will learn more about David and the Psalms and songs that he wrote. Students are learning Deuteronomy 6:5 *"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength".*

In **math** we will begin learning about shapes. We will also continue to work in our number books to complete pages 7 and 8.

In **Health** we will be learning about the four zones of Zones of Regulation and which feelings belong in each zone.

Tuesday is library day, please continue to do a great job returning your books!

Junior Kindergarten B- Mrs. Casadio:

Another great week here in JK!

Our student of the week last week was Eden!

On Tuesday afternoon we had a special visitor in our class. Firefighter Dave came in to teach us all about fire safety and to show us all his equipment. The students had a blast.

In **language**, we have continued to focus on blending and segmenting words. Our letter of the week was the letter "I".

In our **"Learning without Tears"** handwriting books we practiced drawing rectangles as well as tracing the letter's "T" and "I".

In **math** we have continued with our number booklets that contain the numbers 1 through 10. We will be using these books to practice tracing our numbers as well as using them for number recognition. We also learned how to count backwards from 10.

In **health** we finished off our unit where we learned all about our 5 senses, by having a taste test. We all got to try different items that were salty, bitter, sweet and sour.

In **science** we made "Fire Slime" as a class and got to play with it afterwards.

In **Bible** we finished up our third unit by learning about David's songs, and learning that "The Lord is Our Shepherd". We also started our fourth unit which began with Jonah and the Whale. We have started practicing our new memory verse for this month.

Our verse this month is from Micah 6:8

"He has shown you, O man, what is good; And what does the Lord require of you But to do justly, To love mercy, And to walk humbly with your God?"

In **art** we made a poppy by tearing up pieces of red and black paper. We also learned a poem to help us remember what the poppy means, called "I'm a little poppy"

Senior Kindergarten

<u> Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida</u>

Thank you for taking time with your child to complete our show and tell drawings last week. We have many beautiful drawings on our classroom windows.

This week we will observe Remembrance Day on Monday by attending an assembly at 9:30am and by making poppies.

We will be reading Pete the Cat and the Perfect Pizza Party and we will be having pizza for lunch on Thursday. Please let me know how many slices of pepperoni pizza your child needs for lunch. We are ordering pizza from Dominos.

We will be learning the short vowel sound of the letter "i" as in igloo, ink, itch etc.

We will be reviewing the **heart words** we have learned already this year: **the**, **I**, **and**. Heart words are words that do not sound out so you need to learn them by heart.

In **math**, we will learn about the number of corners and sides on the circle, triangle, and rectangle, counting to 20 and reviewing what is next in a sequence of 3 numbers.

In **Bible**, we will finish the unit with Jacob's return to his family. Our memory verse is **Micah 6:8**.

With **Handwriting Without Tears**, we have been reviewing uppercase letters that are frog jump letters which means you print a big line from the top down and then frog jump up to complete the letter such as B, R, E, F. Last week we finished with letters that begin at the top left corner for example Y, Z, H, K, W and now we are wrapping up the uppercase letter portion with letters that begin in the middle and then curve such as C, O, Q, S, A . Please encourage your child to print from left to right and top to bottom.

Grade 1 - Ms. Denhartog:

Math - Number sense: We are working on ordinal numbers this week and then we will move onto addition and subtraction with numbers to 100.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week we will be working on the graphemes **CH** and a review of all the graphemes we have done this year. Please see the homework practice sheets and spelling words going home today to help the students practice these phonics. Plans: * We will be returning to our unit on *Les Vêtements* (Clothing). An assignment will be given involving designing and describing [in detail] the outfits of some provided [pages with blackline master outlined] and named individuals.

Last Week's Weekly Highlights -

- 1. **Testing Loop Planes**: In our STEM lesson, we dove into testing loop planes. The goal behind this activity was to help students understand the principles of aerodynamics and engineering through hands-on learning. By creating and testing their own loop planes, the students got to explore the design process, test their theories, and adjust their models to see how small changes could improve flight performance. It was a great exercise in problem-solving and teamwork!
- 2. Underground Spirit Staff Week Fun: This past week the staff participated in a series of quirky and fun events. Teachers showed up in a variety of wacky outfits with puzzling accessories—from sipping out of strange "cups" to dressing monochromatically, sporting slippers, to going all out as our favourite holidays, to being lumberjacks with mismatched shoes! The students were thoroughly puzzled but also had a blast trying to figure out what was going on. It was a fun, community-building experience that allowed everyone to connect through laughter and curiosity.
- 3. **Remembrance Day Posters**: In honor of Remembrance Day, the students worked on posters for the Legion's competition. They put their creativity to work, creating meaningful artwork that reflects the significance of Remembrance Day and the importance of honouring our veterans. It was a wonderful opportunity for the students to reflect on the sacrifices made by others while expressing their own thoughts and gratitude through art.
- 4. *Jokes Over the PA System*: A few of the students were able to share their best jokes over the PA system during our weekly announcements this past week. It was a great way to spread some laughter and joy throughout the school.

Language - In reading we will look at fact and opinion. In writing we will continue to work on narrative writing. We will also spend some time writing Remembrance Day poems. In grammar we will be looking at four types of sentences. In fluency we will continue to look at Canadian Geese. We will be working on making connections this week. We will also be working with *Anne of Green Gables*. In spelling our next test will be on Nov. 25th. We will continue our game series called Spelling Survivor as a way to practice. Please watch your child's agenda for nightly spelling practice activities for at home review. Through a variety of games we are also working on phoneme awareness, phonics, and vocabulary expansion this week too.

Bible - We will keep exploring the Fruit of the Spirit and how to apply them in our daily devotion time. We're starting a new unit called Journey Two, but we'll also dedicate part of our Bible lessons to our new mission as Justice Seekers. Please watch for a letter coming home with more information about this mission and what we will be working on this month.

Our **memory work** for this month is: "He has shown you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8" Due: Nov. 29th.

Science - This week we will continue our unit on Flight. We will be looking at altering flight. We will be asking questions, such as, "What factors can be adjusted to change the trajectory of a flying object?" and "How do pilots alter the flight of an airplane?". We will also be doing a STEM investigation called Floating Ping Pong Ball - Investigation where we will examine the principles of lift and buoyancy.

Health - We will begin a unit on anti-bullying. We will begin by looking at what bullying is, how to recognize it, and its effects. We will be learning to recognize different forms of bullying, discussing its emotional and physical effects, and participating in hands-on activities such as role-playing scenarios and creating informative posters.

Art – Sketches Nov. 1-10 are due Nov. 28th. Nov. art vocabulary and art history quiz will be on Nov. 28th. We will wrap up our Remembrance Day posters and will begin to learn about space. Grade 6 will be looking at one-point perspective, whereas, Grade 7 will look at two-point perspective as we create cityscapes.
