From the Principal's Desk...

One of my favorite devotionals is, *New Morning Mercies* by Paul Tripp. His profound insights on God's grace have been instrumental in my walk with Him, deepening my understanding of my need for forgiveness and the incredible power of grace. This has humbled me in so many ways.

A recent entry on his Weekly Wednesday devotionals caught my attention, and I want to share a portion of it with you. It's titled "The Danger of Assumptions" and addresses a crucial point: why we often fail to ask better questions and truly listen to one another. When we assume, we do not ask. If we do not ask, we open ourselves up to a world of invalid conclusions and misunderstandings. Tripp encourages us to adopt a habit of inquiry—asking "What?" "How?" and "Why?" to foster clearer communication and deeper connections.

1. **"WHAT?"** Always ask people to define their terms.
2. **"HOW?"** Always ask people to clarify what they mean with concrete, real-life examples of the terms they have used.
3. **"WHY?"** Always ask people to explain why they responded as they did in the examples they have given you.

He concludes with this prayer,

A Prayer for Today: *Lord, help me to avoid being inaccurate, unhelpful, and misguided. I don't want to be the kind of person who constantly makes assumptions about others, not asking questions and jumping to false conclusions. Would you help me to be an instrument of comfort and care in the lives of others around me as I minister in your name? Help me to avoid misunderstandings and confusion, and help me to be curious about others by first asking thoughtful and intentional questions. In Jesus' name, amen.*

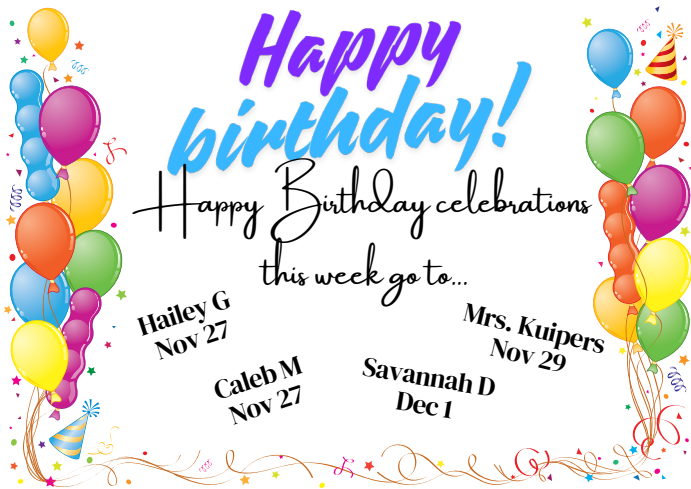

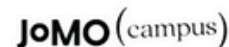

JR Kindergarten

Junior Kindergarten A - Mrs. Baarda

Welcome to the last week of November!

This week we will continue with our transportation theme and we will be making a boat silhouette picture with a watercolour background. We will also experiment to see which objects sink and which float.

In **language** we will continue to practice rhyming, and listening for initial sounds in words and names. We have also begun to segment words into syllables.

In our **Handwriting Without Tears** workbooks this week we will be tracing letters **B, R** and **K**.

Our **mystery letter** last week was letter **Cc**. We learned that cat, car, carrot and Charlotte all begin with the letter C. This week we have a new letter that makes the same sound as C.

In **math** we will be learning about circles and triangles. We will also be making shapes using geoboards.

In **Bible** we will be reading about the birth of Jesus. We have begun learning the song "Away in a Manger" to sing at the Christmas program in December. We will also be learning **Luke 2:6-7 "While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."**

As part of our school theme this month, we will be learning about justice and what that word means in our classroom. We will read a story about justice and we have been listening to the song Micah 6:8 to become familiar with the verse for this month.

In **health** we will begin our new unit about families. I would love it if you could send in a family photo for us to display during this unit.

Tuesday is *library day*. Please remember to send in your library books in the bag provided by the librarians. These bags are to help protect the books from water damage from spills and leaks.

Thank you to Mrs. Casadio for arranging the visit last week with the OPP officer for our classes. The students really enjoyed asking questions and getting to see the police car!

Junior Kindergarten B- Mrs. Casadio:

In **language**, we have started splitting up words into how many syllables they have, our letter of the week was **K**.

In our "**Learning without Tears**" handwriting books we learned how to trace and write the letter **O**, the letter **Q** and the letter **G**.

In **math** we have continued with our number booklets that contain the numbers 1 through 10.

We also began learning how to do a basic graph.

This week we graphed what foods and animals we like the most.

We also talked about what clothing items we are likely/unlikely to wear in the different seasons.

In **health** we learned about staying healthy but what to do if we do end up getting sick to help us feel better fast.

In **Bible** we learned about Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego and the story of Daniel in the Lions Den.

We also learned about "The Golden Rule" and how to treat others the way we want to be treated.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will focus on the sound of letter **N** and learn the new sight word "**a**". We begin reading decodable texts which means reading a sentence or two that contains words that have the letter sounds that we have learned. The students will have to draw a picture to go with the sentences. They will be sent home once they have mastered the reading. Please read them with your child.

In **math**, we will be describing and comparing flat shapes and learning position words such as above, below, near, far and beside.

In **Bible**, we will begin hearing the best story ever. The birth of Jesus. We will begin learning about Zechariah and Elizabeth and baby John. Math - Number sense: We are working on addition and subtraction on a number line with numbers to 100.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week we will be working on the graphemes **NK** and **review of spelling longer words with digraphs**. Please see the homework practice sheets and spelling words going home today to help the students practice these phonics. They write their spelling words in their agendas, but please check their spelling words on Mrs. Kuipers' weekly message as well.

Social studies: This week we continue looking at the traditions and holidays celebrated in Canada.

Bible: We write our Bible test on Intertestamentary times tomorrow. The summary page with everything they had to learn went home last week Monday in their agendas. 4. We started reading Anne of Green Gables and are already captivated by Anne's adventures, vivid imagination, and her knack for finding (and creating!) excitement.
5. Researching Homelessness with a Unique Lens
6. This week, we continued to explore homelessness in depth, learning not only about the issue, but also how to adapt our presentations for different audiences. From sharing age-appropriate details to adjusting tone and focus, it's been an eye-opening experience in empathy and communication.

Here's to another week of learning and growth!

We will learn to create vivid and engaging narratives by mastering sensory details. In grammar, we will be working on editing and will also go on quests to review the various parts of speech - specifically looking at adverbs, pronouns, prepositions, conjunctions and interjections. In fluency, we will be reading a text on Acorns. In phonics, we will vocabulary building, phonemic awareness, phonological awareness, syllable segmentation, phoneme blending, phoneme segmentation, and word recognition . We will also be working on *Anne of Green Gables*. In spelling, our next test will be on Dec. 9th. Please watch your child's agenda for nightly spelling practice activities for at home review.

Bible - We're continuing to learn about Journey Two, but we'll also dedicate part of our Bible lessons to our new mission of being Justice Seekers. We are running a clothing drive through to the end of the month, so please collect your unneeded clothes and send them to school so that we can bless people in our community with them. We will also be completing and presenting a research project about homelessness.

Due: Nov. 29th.

Science - This week we will continue our unit on Flight. We will be discussing the aerodynamics of flying discs. Ask questions like "What makes a frisbee fly?" and "How does the shape of the disc contribute to its flight?" We will also complete a STEM challenge with a frisbee. We will also compare and contrast the principles of flight between hot air balloons and airplanes. Asking questions like "What are the main differences in how these two types of aircraft achieve lift?" and "How is control maintained in each?"

Health - We will continue to learn about bullying.
