From the Principal's Desk...

Today, January 20 is Martin Luther King Jr. Day south of our border. A number of years ago I was in Atlanta, Georgia to take a course in Restorative Justice and while I was there I visited the Martin Luther King Center, his family home, and the church that he preached in. As I visited the sites I was reminded of the transformative power of Dr. King's vision for justice, equality, and unity. The enduring themes of his work should resonate with our mission and values as a Christ-centered community. As the United States still struggles with ensuring basic rights for all its citizens, I wonder if we as Canadians also need to grapple with some of these same questions.

Dr. King's unwavering commitment to justice echoes the biblical call to "act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8). He demonstrated that standing against injustice is not just a societal obligation but also a spiritual one, rooted in the understanding that all people are created in the image of God. This belief drives us at LCS to cultivate an environment where every student feels valued and supported, recognizing the inherent worth and dignity of each individual. Last Friday at our chapel, Mrs. Heida and the Kindergarten class shared those very thoughts as they described how God made snowflakes special and unique and only when millions of snowflakes connect together can we make snowmen and snowballs. The Kindergarten class then connected this thought with us as image bearers. We are each special and unique and when we join with other believers we can do great things for Christ.

Another cornerstone of Dr. King's work was his emphasis on unity and reconciliation. In his famous "I Have a Dream" speech, he envisioned a world where people of all races and backgrounds could come together in harmony. At LCS, this vision aligns with our pursuit of a Christ-centered community. We strive to model and teach our students the importance of embracing diversity, building meaningful relationships, and resolving conflicts with grace and humility.

Dr. King also inspired generations with his courage and perseverance in the face of adversity. His reliance on faith and nonviolence serves as a powerful reminder that transformation often requires patience, prayer, and unwavering hope. These qualities are at the heart of our Teaching for Transformation framework, which encourages students to develop as active participants in God's restorative work in the world.

Let us take time to reflect on how we, as individuals and as a school community, can embody these principles in our daily lives. Whether through acts of kindness, standing up for what is right, or fostering understanding across differences, we have the opportunity to live out Dr. King's dream in ways that honor Christ and His kingdom.

May this day serve not only as a moment of remembrance but also as a call to action—to be agents of change, rooted in love and guided by faith. Together, let us continue building a school community where every student is inspired to transform the world for Christ, just as Dr. King envisioned a world transformed by justice and love.

<u>Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida</u>

Thank you to all the parents who were able to assist with skating. The students made great progress over the three skating opportunities. Your support is greatly appreciated.

This week in SK we will continue to focus on the sound of the letter **Dd** as well as printing lowercase "**d**". When you print lowercase "d", you begin with magic "c" and then go up and back down to bump the line. That is one way to show that it is different from the letter "b".

Reading logs were sent home as an option for students to read with their parents or for parents to read to their child. These paragraphs have words made up of the letter sounds that we have been introduced too. If reading other stories to your child is working better, then stick with that. We will have a reading book party at the end of February to celebrate reading whether or not your child has completed the reading log.

In **math**, we are working on printing numbers to **9**. We are working from left to right on our slates and really focusing on not having reversals. While we print numbers we are working on recognizing numbers and counting out the correct amount for each number.

In **Bible**, we are moving forward with the story of Joseph being sold as a slave and working for Potiphar and the way Potiphar's wife tricked him.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we are working on proper pencil grips and printing lowercase "**v**" and "**w**".
