From the Principal's Desk...

Here at Listowel Christian School, we believe that the purpose of education goes far beyond simply achieving good marks—it's about nurturing the whole child, their character, their faith, and their growth in knowledge. Next week your child will bring home a report card which will highlight his/her learning at school. As report cards are distributed, it's important for us to remember that these documents are not just a snapshot of academic performance, but also an opportunity to celebrate progress, identify areas for growth, and encourage continued learning.

Instead of focusing solely on grades, you are encouraged to look at report cards with a "growth mindset." This means celebrating the effort and perseverance students put into their learning, regardless of the final marks. By framing report cards as a reflection of personal development, you can help your children see challenges as opportunities for improvement rather than as obstacles.

Ask your child what they learned throughout the term, both academically and personally. Engage in meaningful conversations about their successes and areas where they struggled. Acknowledge the hard work that went into mastering new concepts and provide positive reinforcement for their resilience in the face of difficulty.

Reading a report card can also be a great time to set new goals. Discuss with your child what they feel proud of and where they want to improve. Rather than focusing on specific grades, talk about skills—whether it's improving in a particular subject, developing better study habits, or working on time management. This collaborative goal-setting helps children take ownership of their learning and encourages them to work towards progress, not perfection.

When parents emphasize growth over grades, it fosters an environment of encouragement and self-confidence. Children who understand that learning is a journey—and that effort is just as valuable as the outcome—are more likely to feel motivated to keep improving. Parents who show genuine interest in the process of learning rather than focusing on marks send a powerful message that the process itself is just as important as the results.

At LCS, we are committed to partnering with parents in raising children who are not only academically successful but also emotionally and spiritually grounded. By embracing the growth mindset in your approach to report cards, you are helping your child cultivate resilience, curiosity, and a love for learning that will stay with them long after they graduate. Remember, it's not about the mark on the paper—it's about the steps your child is taking on their unique learning journey. Let's celebrate the growth that happens every day at Listowel Christian School.







Good luck to our Hockey team as they participate in the Tournament in Fergus on Thursday.



It was a pleasure to have time to reflect on each student last week as I wrote report cards. God has made each child just right! Thank you for sharing your child with LCS!

We are working on the sound of letter **D***d* and how to print uppercase and lowercase "*d*". Please encourage your child to begin with the magic "*c*" and then go up to the top line and bump and back down to bump the lower line to print the letter "d". Lowercase "d" is a magic c letter. Lowercase "b" is a diver letter. That is the difference.

Thank you to those who have returned your reading logs. It looks like some fun reading is happening. A new page will come home on Monday focusing on the short vowel "o" sound. Keep having fun with reading.

In **math**, we are printing numbers **1** to **10**, counting out objects from 1 to 10 and ordering a number line from 1 to 10. We will begin a new unit to focus on comparing numbers between 1 and 10.

In **Bible**, we are learning about Joseph and how he depended on God when times were good and not so good for him. Our memory work is **Psalm 139:14**.

In **Handwriting Without Tears** we will be printing lowercase "*t*" which is an above the line letter. Have your child show you the signs we use for above the line, below the line and between the line letters.

In **Health**, we will learn a little more about what it means to be a social detective. Please take a moment to read the letter that has been sent home.

Grade 2 - Mrs. Grundlingh:

With all the snow days last week, our work for the week is similar to last week. This is what I hope we can do this week:

Math - Number sense: We will finish up addition and subtraction with numbers to 100 some more.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week we will continue looking at compound words as well as open and closed syllables. Please see the homework practice sheets and spelling words going home today to help the students practice these phonics. They write their spelling words in their agendas, but please check their spelling words on Mrs. Kuipers' weekly message as well.

Social studies: This week we start reviewing our unit on family and traditions as we prepare to start a new unit soon. We will be doing a Social Studies quiz next week Tuesday February 4th.

Science - an end of unit project is coming home today in the mail bags. It is an at Home Project. Students need to pick a recipe from home that they have made before or if they haven't made anything, something they like to eat (muffins, cookies, Kraft Dinner, spaghetti, etc.). They will need to fill out the booklet telling the ingredients of the recipe and identifying which are solids and which are liquids. Then answer the questions in the booklet. Students are encouraged to do all of the printing, but parents are welcome to help with spelling and can provide a break by scribing verbatim occasionally. If students are really struggling to complete at home, I can offer help at recess if a recipe is sent in to work off of. Projects will be due NEXT **Thursday, Feb 6**.

Math - We are wrapping up our measurement unit this week and moving into identifying and creating Growing and Shrinking Patterns. At home, students would benefit by practicing their skip counting up to 100! Can your child count by 2s, 5s, 10s, and 25s forward and backward.

Language - In reading, we will continue to work on our reading comprehension and vocabulary expansion skills through *Anne of Green Gables*. In writing, we will begin to work on fictional story writing. In grammar we will look at different types of sentences and their punctuation. Watch for spelling activities coming home this week in your child's agenda. Spelling test will be moved to *Mon. Feb. 17th* to accommodate the lost days we've had over the last couple of weeks, and to ensure proper study time.
