Listowel Community Faces Challenging Week, United in Support and Prayer

This week has been difficult for members of the Listowel Christian school community. It has been a time of sorrow, loss, and concern, but also a powerful reminder of the strength and resilience that resides in our small town.

The past week began with a devastating barn collapse that left one worker injured. The scene was harrowing, but thanks to the quick response of local emergency services and the support of fellow community members, the injured worker received the care needed. While the physical toll was great, the emotional weight of the incident reverberated throughout Listowel. We continue to pray for healing, strength, and comfort for the worker and the Wilting family in this difficult time.

As if that tragedy weren't enough, the community was then struck by a shed fire, which led to a loss of power to the chicken barns on the property. In these trying moments, the community showed its true spirit. Neighbors checked in on one another, offered support, and provided whatever assistance they could to help one another weather the storm.

Amidst these events, a number of illnesses have also swept through, leaving many feeling unwell. With families facing hardships on multiple fronts, it has certainly been a week of challenges. Yet, it is during such times that the best of what Listowel represents shines brightest.

In the face of adversity, the community has come together in remarkable ways. From offering physical aid to offering words of encouragement, we've seen countless acts of kindness. The bonds that unite us have never been stronger, whether it's through volunteering, sharing resources, or simply keeping one another in prayer.

Through it all, we are reminded that God is in control. While the hardships may seem overwhelming, our faith and the love of this community carry us through. We know that even in the worst of times, we are not alone. God's presence is felt in the hands that help, the words that heal, and the prayers that uplift.

Let us continue to lift each other up in prayer, for healing, strength, and resilience. Let us remember that even in the darkest moments, we are held by the light of our shared faith. The road ahead may be tough for some of us, but together, we will face it—united in spirit, grounded in love, and carried by the grace of God.

Please continue to keep those affected by these events in your prayers, and remember that, as a community, we are stronger together.



<u> Junior Kindergarten A - Mrs. Baarda</u>

During the month of March we will be exploring nursery rhymes by reading some favourites, and by creating some art based on some of the rhymes.

In **language** we will add listening for final sounds to our practice each morning of language skills.

Our mystery letter last week was the letter *Qq*. We learned that there are not as many words that begin with the letter *Q*! Queen, quilt, and quail, begin with Q. We practiced the sound Q makes using the Jolly Phonics song and searched for upper and lowercase Qq. What will our new mystery letter be this week? In our workbooks we will begin to print lowercase letters this week.

In **Bible** we will learn about the Lord's Prayer, and we will read the parables of the Pharisee and the Tax collector and also the Widow's offering. Our new memory verse is Psalm 119:90 "*Your faithfulness continues through all generations; you established the earth, and it endures.*" This month we will be learning the song "Zacchaeus".

In **math** we will learn about helpful numbers 5 and 10. We will be doing some estimating and we will be counting up to 20. Our focus colour is white, our focus shape is diamond and our focus number is 7.

We are thankful for Mrs. Slotegraaf, Mrs. Jantzi and Ms. Miller for joining us on our trip to North Perth Library. Fun was had by all! The weather was absolutely amazing!

This week we will review the sound of short vowel *Uu* and hard *Gg* like in goat. We will be printing beginning sounds, rhyming words and sorting by the number of syllables.

In **math**, we will wrap up our unit of measurement by learning about money, especially coins and the names of each coin. We are counting to 70 and reviewing 1 more than with numbers between 40 and 50.

In **Bible**, we will learn about the Ten Commandments and the Golden Calf. We will see how the Israelites disobeyed God and God forgave them again and again. The new throughline for March is Order Discovering and our memory verse is Psalm 119:90, *"Your faithfulness continues through all generations, you established the earth, and it endures."*

On **Thursday** is Dr. Seuss' birthday party that we will celebrate as a team event. Please come dressed up as a Dr. Seuss character. There is a link in the Weekly Messenger for some ideas. Keep costumes simple.

After March Break, our show and tell will be Hidden Treasures that fit in a paper bag that has a rhyme on it.
